

## Alumni Thriving in Regional Museums, Doctoral Programs, Teaching Positions and More

After graduating from the MA in History program, alumni have taken diverse paths to thrive in many different fields. Alexander Serrano ('22, pictured above) has gone on to doctoral studies at UC Santa Barbara, and others have pursued further graduate work in other University of California campuses in the region, and further afield from Arizona to Mississippi. Some alumni have begun working as lecturers and adjunct faculty at neighboring two- and four-year institutions (Matt Patino '23, pictured above, is currently Adjunct Instructor of History at Crafton Hills College), some traveling across the country or to Europe to teach. Several alumni are working in museums around Los Angeles and San Bernardino County, while others enrolled and graduated from our program all while continuing to teach their students in junior high and high schools. Michael Chavez ('22, pictured above) worked for the UCLA Fowler Museum before returning to our campus to serve as interim program manager at CSUSB for implementation of the Native American Graves Protection and Repatriation Act (NAGPRA). Along with Dr. Daisy Ocampo (CSUSB History) and Lina Tejeda ('24, pictured above), Chavez also worked on the "Fire Kinship" exhibit at the Fowler, set to open in January 2025 (see below).
