Visiting Guidelines

We are thrilled to share with you this unique opportunity to visit the Community-based Art Prison Arts Collective project on site. We look forward to introducing you to our arts programming and welcoming you as a guest. Please use the following guidelines to supplement the visitor guide. These will support a smooth visit for everyone.

Please do not wear solid blue, green, orange, red, green, brown, or yellow clothing. Acceptable options include: **Black, patterns, and plaids.**

Please dress conservatively with closed-toe shoes. Please refrain from wearing tight or revealing clothing, excessive jewelry items, or visible body piercings or tattoos.

In addition, the following clothing items are NOT allowed:

- Tank Tops or any other low-cut shirts
 - Sweatpants or Hoodies
 - Blue jeans or blue denim
 - Leggings, shorts, or skirts with a hemline above the knee
 - Athletic team logos
- It is **very** important that you pay attention to these restrictions.

You may be refused entry into the facility if you do not comply with the visitor dress code.

Please bring the same ID you used for clearance (i.e. Driver's License). DO NOT FORGET THIS! You CANNOT bring in a cell phone, camera, purse, etc.

You may bring in your ID, a water bottle, granola bars if needed, and car keys. If it is raining, you may also bring along a small umbrella. Everything else you must leave behind. Please plan accordingly!

You must stay with the Community-based Art group in the designated space. **Please do not wander.**

Rules for conversations with inmate participants: **NO** sharing of personal information. Please also refrain from asking about a participant's offense or other personal information. Beyond that, please feel free to have normal, friendly interactions!

You also may NOT give anything to or receive anything from an inmate participant.
