Message from the Dean



It is with great sense of excitement and anticipation that I welcome this opportunity to serve as dean and university librarian at the Pfau Library at CSUSB. I am very appreciative of the warm welcome that I received from all of the library's personnel, the university administration, and the campus faculty. I particularly welcome the opportunity to work on a campus that is student-centered, collegial, and values community participation.

As part of my transition to this position, I have met with all of the members of the library team, both individually and in groups. The purpose of these meetings was to identify issues and concerns that needed to be addressed immediately, to become acquainted with roles and responsibilities, and to draft a plan of action.

I also made it a point to meet individually with each dean and major stakeholder in the university in order to begin developing positive working relationships. For example, during my meeting with the dean of the College of Business and Public Administration, Dr. Karen Dill Bowerman, we agreed to provide a venue in the library for presentations by featured authors in the field of leadership. The conversation

with the dean of the College of Education, Dr. Patricia Arlin, focused on library support for the newly established Ed.D. program. We also spoke about the dire need to upgrade the curriculum collection, which supports teacher preparation.

The vision that is beginning to evolve is one of an academic library ready to reinvent and reinvigorate itself in order to pursue its mission and serve its clientele at an optimum level. I see a library that wants to become a full and active partner with the CSUSB campus in the teaching, learning, and research functions of the university. Toward that end, the library is exploring the feasibility of instituting a liaison program to reconnect with faculty in each of the colleges. It is also planning to expand its information literacy program to serve and connect with a greater number of students. Part of the vision is to become a modern, efficient, and effective academic library by continuing to make extensive use of information technology. The Pfau Library could also become a center of culture and learning for CSUSB and the surrounding community by hosting artistic and cultural programs and exhibits. Ideally, these events would be hosted in partnership with colleges and organizations on and off campus.

In the pursuit of this vision, the staff and librarians have begun to conduct short-term planning in the following areas: Web page design, space utilization, collection development, and information literacy. Work-flow analysis is being conducted in several areas of the library in order to streamline operations. Library-wide committees have been formed to assist with communication and coordination of functions, including the Library Space Planning Committee (ad hoc) and the Library Information Technology Council. Soon after we finish our short-term planning, the library will begin strategic planning processes for the purpose of drafting long-term goals and objectives that are in line with those of CSUSB and the CSU system.

The staff and librarians have been busy improving the products and services that the library provides its users. For example, the library's Web page is new and improved, and inter-library loan (ILL) services were streamlined after adding an additional staff member to the unit. The library is in the process of

Hail Cesar! Pfau Library Welcomes New Dean

On July 2 the Pfau Library welcomed our new dean/ university librarian, Cesar Caballero. He comes to the Pfau Library from California State University Los Angeles where he was both associate university librarian (2003-2004 and 2006-2007) and acting university librarian (2004-2006).

Dean Caballero began his library career as a student assistant at the University of Texas at El Paso. Intending to become the family accountant, he was majoring in business administration. But a librarian named Jess Dugan, the associate dean of the library, became his mentor and changed the direction of his life. He invited the undergraduate to librarian functions and workshops. He encouraged him to consider librarianship as an option. Though at first Caballero rejected the idea, eventually he asked what he needed to do to enter library school. Caballero realized that he "really loved what libraries were all about, especially academic libraries. What a concept!" After receiving his bachelor's degree in 1972, he entered the University of Texas at Austin and earned an MLIS (1974).

Caballero returned to the University of Texas at El Paso as a librarian. His time there was formative as he served as the head of the circulation department (1976-1978), then the head of archives and special collections (1979-1990), before becoming associate university librarian (1995-2003). Through his varying responsibilities, he was "always interested in administrative roles. It was my goal all along."

In 2003, he left UT El Paso for the California State University, Los Angeles to pursue new challenges. When the bell of opportunity rang at the Pfau Library, he "wasn't looking for something new," he said at his interview, "but there comes a time when you want to steer the ship." Since his arrival, Dean Caballero has been getting the lay of the land, talking with faculty and staff, listening to their interests and concerns within the library. While he does not wish to impose his ideas, his vision for the Pfau Library is as "a learning and cultural resource not only for the campus, but for the region. I want to move this library through the 21st century in order to support a very modern university."

Dean Caballero has written several articles in respected library periodicals, indexed for the *Chicano Periodicals Index*, and written or contributed to seven books. He is currently ABD in higher education administration at Texas Tech University. The title of his dissertation will be *Strategic Planning for Delivery of Electronic Information in Higher Education.*

MEDLINE

Previously available only in the free PubMed interface, *MEDLINE* is now available on our EBSCOhost platform. This allows us to offer the library's "Search for Full Text" button, to help researchers easily locate articles available from the library, or link to Interlibrary Loan for those that are not.

GROVE ART ONLINE

This reference work covers the full text of The Dictionary of Art and The Oxford Companion to Western Art. It includes access to the Bridgeman Library of Art Images.

GROVE MUSIC ONLINE

Covers The New Grove Dictionary of Music and Musicians 2nd edition, The New Grove Dictionary of Opera, and The New Grove Dictionary of Jazz. Also includes some embedded sound clips.

PILOTS: Published International Literature On Traumatic Stress

This specialized psychology database indexes literature on post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) and other mental-health sequelae of traumatic events.

PSYCARTICLES (new interface) Previously on ProQuest, now on the familiar Ebscohost platform, where our *PsycINFO* subscription already resides. Covers the full text of nearly 60 journals published by the American Psychological Association.

Our **SpringerLink** journal titles now include access to archived volumes, often covering the entire publication run of a journal, thanks to system-level funding through the CSU's SEIR office.

His duties will include attending ALA MidWinter and Annual Conferences, all Council meetings, and keeps the CLA membership informed of significant discussions and actions by ALA Council. He continues in his role as Association of College & Research Libraries (ACRL) Chapters Council Delegate, a position he was elected to in a state-wide election by California Academic & Research Libraries (CARL) members. In this role, he attends ACRL Chapters Council meetings held during the ALA MidWinter and Annual Conferences. In his capacity with both positions, he serves respectively on the Executive Committee of CLA, and the Executive Board of CARL. He also serves as a member of the WASC (Western Association of Schools & Colleges, Accrediting Commission for the Senior Colleges & Universities) Substantive Change Committee. This committee reviews and takes formal actions on proposals which describe a substantive change involving new sites or off-campus programs, distance education, degree levels, or organizational changes. Currently, he is the only librarian serving on this committee.

Rosemary Navarro, circulation department, accepted the position of library assistant I effective May 14, 2007. Ms. Navarro had been working at the Rancho Cucamonga Public Library, Main Branch. In September, she was reassigned to the ILL unit (55% time) and Circulation (45% time).
