“Embrace the Change”: Johnnie Ann Ralph Retires

Thirty-six years ago, on a gusty January morning, Johnnie Ann Ralph walked resolutely into the Pfau Library to begin her first job as a professional librarian. Johnnie had completed both her undergraduate and graduate degrees in history from the University of California, Riverside. She came to California State College, San Bernardino with a master’s degree in library science from the University of Kentucky.

Johnnie was hired as a generalist, but in the next several years she would serve as head of library operations, head of technical services, and head of public services. Johnnie notes that, in these positions, she “had the opportunity to introduce the first technologies into library operations.” In the early 1980s, for example, she coordinated the installation of the library’s first automated circulation system. A few years later, she oversaw the planning and implementation of the library’s first online public access catalog, which signaled the demise of the card catalog.



When the library addition was funded in 1989, Johnnie — as associate university librarian — embraced her new responsibility of coordinating the design, planning, and construction of the new wing, which added nearly 50,000 square feet to the building. The wing was completed in 1993, positioning the library to meet the demands of a growing, changing campus population. Johnnie considers this experience to be a milestone in her long career. “My only disappointment is that the rest of the library addition has not been completed yet.”

The commercialization of the Internet was underway and the World Wide Web was about to become a

household word when Johnnie was named university librarian. In this role, she guided the library and its staff through the technological and operational changes of the ‘90s, managing the inflated cost of utilities, equipment, and subscriptions.

Determined to meet the changing information needs of the campus, Johnnie “prioritized her priorities,” as she says, overseeing a gradual shift in emphasis

from print to electronic resources. Thus, in addition to a book collection of 750,000 items, the library now has access to hundreds of electronic books and thousands of full-text electronic journals, all of which can be accessed from off campus. All of the library’s services have online components. Johnnie is especially pleased that, by the time she departs campus this summer, a new-generation integrated library system will have been unveiled, one that streamlines operations in library acquisitions, circulation, and public service systems.

Johnnie looks back at her career fondly. “Most important to me have been my interactions with my colleagues and the students. I thank them for what they have taught me and for their support of the Pfau Library.” Johnnie’s plans for the future include appreciating her free time, reading more often, and enjoying spontaneous visits with family. She also hopes to stay engaged with the campus. When asked if she has words of wisdom for the library staff and faculty as they prepare for new leadership, she smiles and says confidently, “Embrace the change.”

Database Developments

The arrival of the new year brings two important full-text databases to the library: *Sage Journals Online* and *Blackwell-Synergy*. Both publishers produce prestigious journals in fields important to CSUSB. Access to these two databases was made possible by the negotiating power of SEIR, the CSU system's central library database office, which gave us the opportunity to subscribe at affordable prices.

Sage Journals Online, from the well-known Sage publishing company, includes 446 scholarly journals, with full text available from 1999 to the present. Sage is particularly strong in the areas of education, psychology, criminal justice, and public administration, with notable titles for nursing and social work.

Blackwell-Synergy, from European-based Blackwell publishing, offers 749 titles, with full-text available from 1997 to the present. Blackwell's strengths are advanced health sciences, business, economics, law, political science, education, and sociology. Many of Blackwell's titles have an international focus.

Since our last ILS implementation more than a decade ago, the technology behind these systems has dramatically improved. This upgrade to the Innovative Interfaces Inc. Millennium product allows library users to search the catalog and retrieve results more quickly and effectively, adding a level of refinement and flexibility previously unavailable.

Behind the scenes, the ordering and processing of books will be streamlined as the system is fully implemented, giving our patrons more rapid access to current materials. On the patron side, the new user-friendly search interface and results screens provide the ability to limit and sort materials at a finer level than ever before. For instance, users can now limit a search to master's theses, audiobooks, new books, as well as many other discrete collections; they can also have their results sorted by relevance, date, author, etc. Other new features are proximity searching of terms and a built in spellchecker with suggested alternative spellings. One other powerful characteristic of the new catalog is that it is designed to never give the user a zero result; instead it lists headings/items the user may want to consider.

There are now several unique personalization features available. Patrons can choose (or not) to save their "reading history," a list of all of the books they have checked out over time. Furthermore, they can save their "preferred searches," and have e-mail alerts sent when new items appear within the search criteria that they have established.

Irene Jones, public services (circulation), celebrates 30 years of service.




