Jeff's interest in Prosthetics and Orthotics came while he was stationed in Atlanta, Georgia, a friend introduced him to the field, but it wasn't until he went to the library to look up the words that his interest was hightened. He found only the words in a dictionary and since he didn't want to make the Army a career he began writing to colleges, and found only 2 schools in the U.S. giving B.S. Degrees in the field. New York University and University of Washington. Since he lived in Washington before he decided to go there. "The field is so competitive that out of 200 applications they only accept 12 a year," said Jeff one of 2 Blacks in the field in California.

The United States has nearly 8 million people ac-tively seeking work and unable to find it. While the underlying economy is str-ong, high interest rates and reduced federal spending probably will add to the unemployment rolls in the period ahead.

Against this background, the Reagan Administration is seriously considering a plan to import hundreds of thousands of Mexian nationals to work in America's

These new jobseekers would be called, in the euphemism of the times,

"guestworkers."

The aim of the White House is not to "soak up" the illegal or undocumented workers already in this country who are variously estimated to total 2 to 12 million. Rather, it is to develop a new program as part of a "North American Accord" to improve rela-tions with Mexico. It also may give President Reagan a card to play when he discusses Mexican oil, gas and other matters when he net with Mexio's president.


