SCULPTURE TO BE UNVEILED

The sculpture for the physical science courtyard is now being given its final touches and plans are being made for installation and unveiling of the completed work on September 10.

The art work, which was designed by sculptor Richard Manchester Hetrick of Los Angeles, expresses the artist's interpretation of electronic motion in an atom. Money for the project was donated to the College.

FACULTY WIVES SPONSOR FACULTY AND STAFF THEATRE TRIP

The Faculty Wives Club has reserved 75 seats for College faculty and staff for the September 8 performance of Eugene O'Neil's "More Stately Mansions" at the Ahmanson Theatre in Los Angeles. According to Mrs. Mary Barnes, who is in charge of the project, all 75 seats have been sold, and those with reservations may pick up the tickets in the Humanities Division office Wednesday, Thursday and Friday of next week.

BUILDING AND LANDSCAPING PROJECTS

Plans for landscaping the two science buildings have been approved and it is hoped that the project will be out for bid within 30 days.

Landscaping will begin this week in an area west of the physical science building. This project, when completed, is expected to give protection from the winds coming from the canyon.

The corporation yard and maintenance shops project was presented to the Public Works Board for approval August 28 and will soon be going out for bid. It is hoped that the work will be completed April, 1968.

Two Cal State - San Bernardino students will be heading for classes in foreign countries on September 3. They are participating in the California State Colleges' International Studies Program.

The students going to Europe from the College are Miss Linda Arth and Miss Cecilia Ramirez, who will fly on the State College's charter flight from San Francisco to Brussels. From there Miss Arth will go on to Uppsala, Sweden and Miss Ramirez will go to Aix-Marseille. Both students have registered at the College for their junior year.

NEW PUBLICATIONS MANAGER

Jim McKone joined the staff as Publications Manager today. A former newspaper columnist and reporter, he was also press representative to former Congressman Ken W. Dyal.

The College office mail boxes have been re-located in the telephone operator's office. Mrs. Gladys Wilson will assume the duty of mail distribution on an experimental basis for an indefinite period of time. The mail posting boxes are also located in that area. Mail delivery and pick-up remain on the same schedule.

CASABO DELIVERY DATE

The Activities and Housing Office has received word that the CASABO, student yearbook, will be ready for distribution September 18. Activities Advisor John Humphries will be in charge of distribution.

STUDENT BODY CONSTITUTION CHANGES

The ASB Senate has appointed a committee to review the present ASB constitution and make recommendations for altering the structure of the present student government. James Penman, Student Body President, states that if the Senate agrees to the recommendations by a two-thirds majority they will be presented for vote to the general student body in the fall.
