

### REGISTRATION EXCEEDS FORECASTS

More than 925 persons had registered at CSCSB as of 10:30 a.m. Thursday, September 28.

Late registrations, plus new people in the 20 night classes, are expected to push the final total over 950 - - possibly near 1,000.

Final registration figures will not be available until Tuesday, Oct. 3.

A student body of 900 had been forecast, with 750 full-time equivalent. The actual FTE figure already had passed 814 yesterday.

### ADMISSIONS OFFICE WORKS LATE

Faculty members received their class cards on time because three people in the Admissions and Records office worked until nearly 2 a.m. Thursday, September 28, to complete them.

The extra work was done by Stephen Prouty, Director of Admissions and Records; Carey Neracher, Registrar; and Bonnie Danskin, Data Processing.

### CLASSROOMS READY, DESPITE CONSTRUCTION DELAYS

Although work continues on the new Physical Science Building, and there is other construction on the campus, all classrooms were made ready for instruction thanks to some last-day overtime work.

Ben Adams, Assistant to the Executive Dean, and Andre Maurel, Supervisor of Building Maintenance, supervised the operation that allowed instruction to start on time. #### CREDIT UNION FACILITIES AVAILABLE

All employees of the College are eligible to join the California State Employees Credit Union, whether or not they are members of the CSEA.

New members are eligible for the savings plan, which is payroll deductible. Members are not eligible for loans until they achieve permanent status (after one year at CSCSB). The credit union insures savings up to \$2,000 and paid a 5 per cent dividend last year. It is located at 437 W. 16th St., San Bernardino.

#### ALL CAMPUS PERSONNEL INVITED TO ACTIVITIES DAY

Tickets are now available, from student salesmen or at the office of the Dean of Activities and Housing, for the All-Campus Cook-Out at 6 p.m. Saturday, October 7.

The Cook-Out costs \$1 for adults, and 50 cents for children under age 10. It will be held at the athletic area.

The other activities on Orientation Activities Day include the opening of Physical Education facilities at 3:30 p.m., the Sophomore vs. Freshmen Challenge Softball Game at 4 p.m., a dance, and a folk concert and folk sing by Clabe Hangan that evening.

"Come to the Activities Day and be surprised by other special events," said G. William Hume, Associate Dean of Activities and Housing. "We promise a fine barbecue meal prepared by Mike O'Gara, the supervising chef."
