CAMPUS ACQUIRES The landscaping project has nearly been completed
"THE NEW LOOK" around the two science buildings. College person-

The entire campus has a "new look" with four major construction
projects under way, plus the expansion of North Park Boulevard to
four lanes. Construction will begin later this month on the new
library. Date of the groundbreaking has not yet been set.

summer. Nearly every visitor to the campus has remarked favorably

FOR VOTER REGISTRATION register for the November 5 general election.

Voter registration is available on campus in Room A-196 from
9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

The law requires persons wishing to register to have lived in
California for one year; however, newcomers not meeting the residen-
tial requirement can vote for President only by special arrangement,
if they are residents of the State of California by midnight, Septem-
ber 12. These "President-only" voters must register directly with
the San Bernardino County Registrar of Voters at 646 Sierra Way Ave.
