#### CONSTRUCTION STARTS ON THEME BUILDING

Site development has begun for the \$5 million, six-floor Library-Classroom Building, the centrally located theme building for the entire campus.

Official groundbreaking ceremonies will be held at 10 a.m. Tuesday, August 27. All campus personnel are invited to attend. Photographers are welcome.

The construction will take approximately 22 months. Occupancy is scheduled for the Fall Term in 1970.

#### CHANCELLOR URGES RESTORING RAISES

Chancellor Glenn S. Dumke has appealed to Governor Ronald Reagan to supplement the California State Colleges' budget with funds from the \$361 million state surplus.

After State Controller Houston Flournoy announced that the state ended the 1967-68 fiscal year with a \$361 million surplus, Dumke said it is now possible for the state to upgrade the faculty salary structure.

The State College Trustees originally requested a 16.85 per cent salary increase for the faculty in 1968-69. The Legislature cut this to 10 per cent and the governor subsequently reduced it to 7.5 per cent.

The 30-day loan is interest-free. There is a 75-cent service charge.

The main lot will be closed to allow Physical Plant employees to put a sand finish on the curves. The sand finish has been wearing away by use, and these sharp curves tend to be slippery in wet weather.
