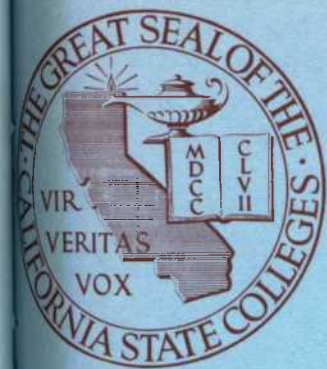

LIBRARY ACQUIRES "EYEWITNESS ACCOUNTS OF THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION" Of interest to American Revolutionary War enthusiasts is the recent addition of Eyewitness Accounts of the American Revolution to the Library's collection.

Thirty works which have not in many instances been readily available have been reprinted by the New York Times and Argo Press. Included in the publication are letters, journals and diaries of soldiers, travelers, Tories and farmers which give an intimate view of the momentous struggle.
