Dr. Hatton replaces Alfred Egge, Biology, who resigned the Executive Committee position in the Senate because of personal reasons.

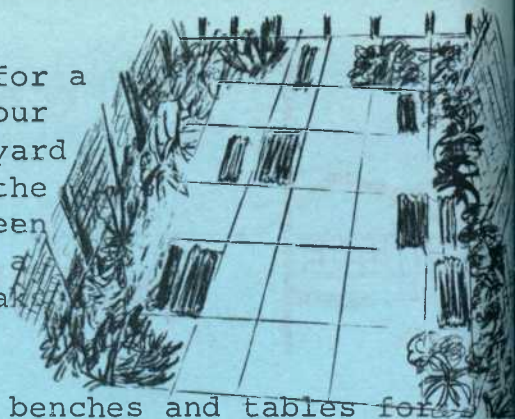
Both Drs. Hatton and Egge will continue to serve as senators.

BILINGUAL PROBLEMS
WORKSHOP SUBJECT

Next weekend an intensive two-day institute in bilingual communication skills will bring 20 Southern California educators to the campus.

The workshop, specifically concerned with the problems of teaching English to Chicanos and Spanish to native speakers and the steady increase of ill-prepared Chicano college students, is aimed to make more effective the present bilingual skills program in higher education, according to Sergio Elizondo, coordinator of the event.

San Fernando Valley State is assisting CSCSB in hosting the institute, which is partly financed by the U.S. Office of Education, and is one of a series being held throughout the Southwest to study problems of the Mexican-American in higher education.

Meetings begin at 8 a.m., Saturday, January 30, in the Library and continue through 3 p.m. Sunday.
