EARLY CHILDHOOD TEACHING CREDENTIAL OFFERED BY CSCSB

The Standard Teaching Credential with Specialization in Early Childhood Teaching has been added to the credential program at CSCSB.

Florence Mote, Assoc. Prof. of Education, Coordinator of the Early Childhood Program which authorizes teaching pre-school through third grade children, initiated and was responsible for its development.

CSCSB joins four other state colleges in offering the program for the first time this fall: Chico, Fresno, Hayward and San Francisco. Sonoma State has had its Early Childhood Teaching Program in operation for one year. Currently there are 21 students enrolled in the CSCSB program.

In setting up the new credential program, Dr. Mote worked closely with junior colleges in the area who have existing early childhood programs to insure transfer of as many credits as possible.

The College will seek approval of the program when the State Department of Education Accreditation Committee visits the campus next February.
