NEW EVENING SERVICES COORDINATOR PLANS OFFICE FOR EVENING STUDENTS

Kent Schofield, Assoc. Professor, History and Assoc. Dean, Academic Planning, will take over the duties of the newly created post of Evening Services Coordinator, President John M. Pfau has announced.

In an effort to provide the maximum services possible for the College's evening students, which number almost 30% of the student body, the Evening Coordinator will establish an office in the Library-Classroom Building to be manned four evenings a week, Monday through Thursday, 4:15 to 9:15 p.m. Location and telephone numbers of the office will be announced later.

FLU SHOTS OFFERED THROUGH OCTOBER 31

Flu shots will continue to be given throughout the month of October by the Health Center, on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays.

The immunization is free to students. Faculty and staff will be charged \$1, payable at the Bursar's Office before coming to the Health Center.

Influenza protection is urged for those with chronic illness (especially heart or lung disease) and those susceptible to respiratory infections.

Since 1970, when he first joined the College staff, Mr. Chouinard has participated in many musical programs and events with the Music Department. Noted for his fine baritone voice, he performed as soloist with the College Choral Society, in music festivals and in musical events in the outside community as well. He was a member of the Chamber Orchestra and served as president of the Choral Society.
