COLLEGE RECEIVES APPROVAL FOR NURSING COURSE FROM BOARD OF NURSING EDUCATION

for classes beginning on or after January, 1974.

The California State Board of Nursing Education and Nurse Registration has granted approval for the proposed curriculum submitted by the College

Dolores Wozniak, Chairman of the Department of Nursing, states that this approval means that "we can offer our first classes at the beginning of the Winter Quarter."

The course, first to be conducted at the College, is Nursing 340, "Analysis of Nursing Thought." Instructed by Dr. Wozniak, the classes are offered Monday and Wednesday in two sections, 10-11:50 a.m. and 4-5:50 p.m.

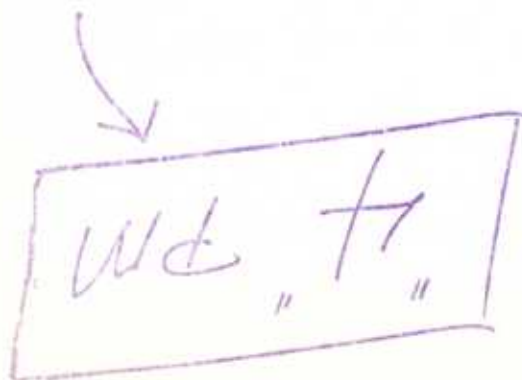
