CSCSB CAR POOL OFFERS SAVINGS IN MONEY & FUEL

As fuel shortages promise to intensify commuting problems for the campus community, Leonard Farwell, Business Manager, has prepared and distributed car pool questionnaires for faculty and staff to determine the patterns of automobile commuting to and from the campus.

Information gathered from the survey will be used to match people living in similar areas with similar work schedules.



The deadline for returning the forms has been extended to Monday, January 21.

Mr. Farwell points out that car pool users will not only save in gasoline purchases and depreciation on autos but through several alternatives to regular parking fee payment: (1) None of the car pool participants buy parking decals; use coin operated lot at 25¢ per day; (2) Only one quarterly or annual decal be purchased for cash, shared in cost by all at the time of purchase; (3) Use payroll deduction system to purchase parking decal by having only one participant deducting the fee from his paycheck each month and the other members of the car pool reimbursing that person.

Refunds will be made to employees who cancel parking fees. Those who have fees on payroll deduction and request cancellation prior to the 20th of the month will have the deduction stopped during the current month.

This adds a third option to the M.A. in Education which previously included specializations in elementary ed-

FRED ROACH RESIGNS DEAN
OF CONTINUING EDUCATION POST

Fred Roach, who joined the administrative staff as the College's first Dean of Continuing Education in 1969, has submitted his resignation, effective June 30, 1974.

Dean Roach, in resigning, cited a family interest in returning to the midwest where he published a weekly newspaper for 10 years. Prior to joining CSCSB Dean Roach, who earned his Ph.D. in Government at Claremont, taught at Claremont Men's College and Northern Arizona University. Here, he has been responsible for developing the Extension program, which has grown to over 3,500 student registrations annually and projected revenues this year of \$150,000; administering Summer Sessions which last year enrolled over 800 students and generated fees in excess of \$116,000; and representing the College in various community organizations and activities.

He has served on the Publications Board and the ad hoc Student Development Committee, as Pawprint advisor, and as College grantsman; taught courses in political science and participated in developing the evening degree completion concept and program on campus.
