FALL REGISTRATION BEGINS IN GYMNASIUM NEXT MONDAY

The 1975-76 academic year gets into full swing today with faculty advisement for Freshmen and Sophomores taking place from 8:30 until 3:30 and an all-day EOP Orientation. Yesterday saw Juniors, Seniors and Graduate Students receive their advisement from faculty.

At 10 a.m. Monday, September 22 Fall registration begins in the Gymnasium with Priority Group C-1 leading off and continues until 6 p.m. On Tuesday Priority Groups A and B register, ending with 4-to-6-p.m. registration of students who applied after August 29 and all other students who were unable to register at one of the earlier time slots.

Classes begin on Thursday, September 25. Late Registration will be held in the Admissions Office from September 25 through October 1, 8 a.m. to 6 p.m., except Fridays, which has 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. hours.

Michael Preston has been named Director of the College's Upward Bound Program, filling the vacancy created when Walter Hawkins took over the duties of Director of Supportive Services for the E.O.P. earlier this summer.

Mr. Preston comes to the CSCSB campus directly from Western Washington State College in Bellingham where he earned his B.A. degree in anthropology-sociology. He was awarded an M.Ed. degree in Student Personnel Administration in June, 1975.

For his internship he counseled other students within the Office of Minority Programs. He also served as a resource person for the institution, organizing a minority student needs assessment workshop.

Currently there are three junior and 33 high school seniors enrolled in the CSCSB Upward Bound Program, which emphasizes improving reading and writing skills for college preparation.
