NEW HOURS AND RATES FOR CHILD CARE CENTER

New hours, a wider range of ages and hourly rates have been established for the College's Child Development Center.

With the extended hours, the center will be open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday. Children from two to twelve years old will be eligible to attend. A rate of \$1.14 per hour will be charged for children of faculty and staff and others who do not qualify for the grant. Student parents who qualify will be charged on a sliding scale.

With the closing of schools for Easter vacation, student parents and faculty and staff with children may be interested in registering their youngsters for the vacation week at the Kendall Elementary site of the center. Those parents who are interested may call Judy Calkins, Director.

Parents who may possibly use the center at some future time on an emergency basis may fill out forms at their convenience in advance. Forms are available at the Center, Room K-1, and in the Office of the Assistant Dean of Students, Gaye Perry.

Notices have been sent to school deans and department heads asking for their assistance in obtaining nominations. All nominations submitted must be accompanied by a recommendation from the department chairperson.

Students interested in being considered for appointment to the Campus Council, and to one of the committees of the Faculty Senate must 1) submit a completed Student Representative Nomination Form, signed by five regularly enrolled students from the same academic major and 2) ask the department chairman in the major to provide a recommendation in support of your nomination.

FRANCES BERDAN, CO-AUTHOR OF BOOK ON AZTEC DOCUMENTS

Frances Berdan, Asst. Prof., Anthropology, is co-author of a book on 16th century Aztec documents in the Nahuatl language, "Beyond the Codices," to be published by the UC Berkeley Press in April. The book will also be Vol. 27 of the UCLA Latin American Center Series. Co-authors are A.J.O. Anderson and James Lockhart.

Dr. Berdan is one of a handful of scholars who study the language. A modified version is still spoken by a million Aztec descendants in outlying Mexican villages where she has done field work. The book covers 250 years of records and correspondence of Indians beginning 20 years after the Spanish conquest of the Aztecs in 1521.

Performing a marathon of music, pianist David Hatt hopes to set a record for the Guinness Book of Records when he plays "Vexations," a piece by Erik Satie, continuously from 1:30 p.m., Thursday, April 8 until 7:30 a.m. Friday, April 9, in the Lower Commons.

The unique 18-hour performance fulfills the original intent of the composer in playing the piece, which although one-page long, was written to be repeated 840 times, slowly and softly.

According to Mr. Hatt, graduate music student, it has never been played completely through by one artist. Usually several pianists play it to its conclusion.

Bids sponsoring the performance will be sold for \$1 per repetition, with proceeds going toward CSCSB concert choral tour expenses. Members of the choir will sell bids at the Commons during the rendition. Bids are also available at the Music Office, FA-102.

Refreshments will be served throughout the performance and listeners are welcome to come and go.
