MAINTENANCE PROGRAM
TO BRING POWER OUTAGE
TO BUILDINGS ON SATURDAYS

A complete electrical shutdown from four to eight hours will be in effect on all buildings on campus in a monthly schedule worked out to prevent as much inconvenience as possible.

All of the outages will occur on Saturdays when the buildings are not in use. The shutdown is being done as part of a preventative maintenance program of the switchgear rooms of the buildings.

FACULTY TO LEARN ADVISING
ON CAREERS FOR LIBERAL ARTS

This year the College will participate in a project designed to train faculty to give accurate, concrete advice on what career opportunities are available to liberal arts majors.

The Chancellor's Office recently approved a multi-campus project, "Faculty Workshops on Academic Career Advising in the Social Sciences," and has allocated the amount of \$35,046 for its implementation and travel expenses.

Five other colleges in the CSUC system will participate in the program, which will be administered by Chico and Northridge campuses. The faculty advisers will be trained to give actual information on employment practices and possibilities in the businesses and government employers in their vicinities as they relate to liberal arts majors.

On the CSCSB campus the Early Career Advising Committee, comprised of faculty members from a number of liberal arts departments, will participate in workshops and share information collected at the Northridge campus.

Jill Kasen, Asst. Prof., Sociology, will serve as campus coordinator.

The College was saddened to learn of the death on Saturday, September 1 of Joseph R. Sartor in Kaiser Hospital in Fontana where he had been hospitalized for several months.
