CHILD CARE CENTER BUILDING BIDS 27% OVER FUNDS AVAILABLE

In bids received last Tuesday for construction of the College's Child Care Center, the lowest came in over 27% of the estimated cost.

The opening, held in San Bernardino County Offices, drew bids from three contractors: Eason Construction Co., \$203,922; Earle Casler, \$222,676 and Howard Edmiston, \$205,000. The Eason bid, the lowest, is \$43,933 over funds available for the building.

The next step will be a review of the situation by San Bernardino county and city departments which are jointly funding the project from community development funds obtained from the federal government. If they find they are unable to provide additional money needed to augment the existing funds in order to meet the bid price, the building plans will be returned to the architect for redesign.

KATHY PEZDEK NAMED
FACULTY DEVELOPMENT
CENTER DIRECTOR

Kathy Pezdek, Associate Professor of Psychology, was recently appointed Director of the Faculty Development Center.

Dr. Pezdek has been with the College for five years, teaching courses in the areas of experimental psychology and statistics.

She takes over the role of director from Carol Goss who was in charge of the center from the Fall of 1977. The faculty development program was established to expand the opportunities to improve and refine teaching methods and to assist faculty in discipline-related activities.

In the past, seminars were conducted, workshops on audio-visual and computer techniques were held as well as discussions on special interest courses and research and teaching discussions.

Dr. Pezdek received her M.S. and Ph.D. degrees from the University of Massachusetts and her B.S. from the University of Virginia. In 1976 she was awarded a \$10,000 grant for a scientific experiment on the interaction of pictures and sentences in the memory. Her new appointment is for 1980 Winter and Spring terms.
