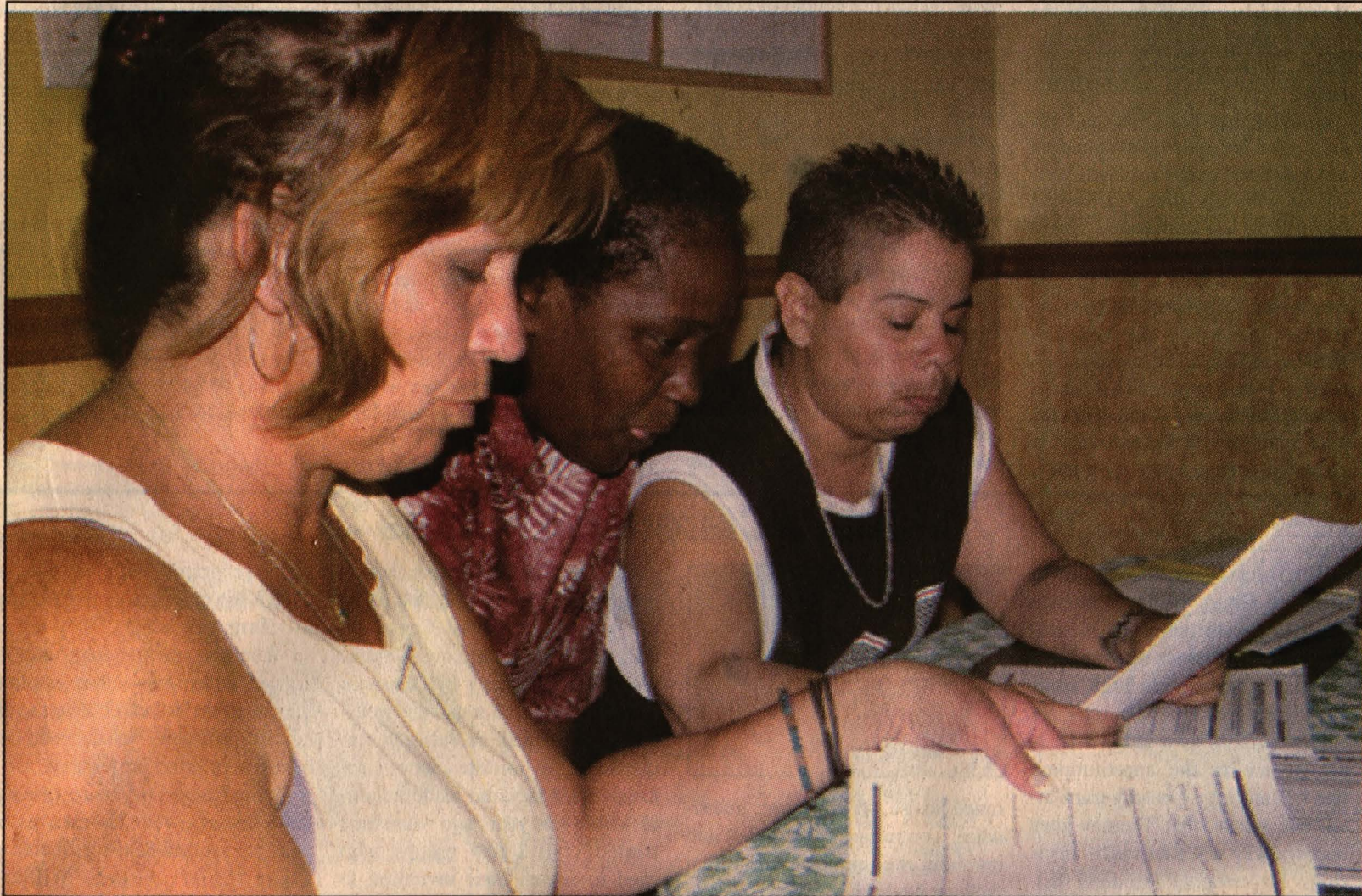

Ex-Felons' Voting Rights Misstated

△ *Silent code: don't ask – don't know*

Ex-felons are routinely given "misleading, erroneous and/or no voting information." National and local prison reform advocates say a silent code of 'don't ask, don't know' will leave millions of ex-offenders on the sidelines as President Bush and Democratic presidential candidate Senator John Kerry battle for votes. The Prison Reform Advocacy Center and Human Rights Watch (HRW) surveyed hundreds of former state inmates and talked with parole officers and election boards in 40 states. The groups found that one in five ex-felons don't realize they can re-register to vote. The survey found widespread confusion at election boards, parole offices and social service agencies. "We even

found a breakdown in communication coming from the pulpit of prison ministries."

"This is absolutely unacceptable, that people who are supposed to know the law...are giving misleading, inconsistent and flat-out wrong information to ex-offenders," said Davis Singleton, executive director of Prison Reform, an Ohio based organization.

Prison reform advocates posing as ex-felons called parole officers

in Riverside, San Bernardino, Ventura and Los Angeles counties. Surveyors were told, "if you are a felon you can't vote." Another officer stated "a felon can vote only after completing 5 years of parole." In California, newly released parolees attend mandatory orientation meetings called PACT. HRW says the weekly meetings almost never discuss voting rights.

In US Gap Between Haves, Have-nots Expands

Over two decades, the income gap has steadily increased between the richest Americans, who own homes and stocks and get big tax breaks, and those at the middle and bottom of the pay scale, whose paychecks buy less.

The growing disparity is even more pronounced in this recovering economy. Wages are stagnant and the middle class is shouldering a larger tax burden.

Prices for health care, housing, tuition, gas and food have soared.

The wealthiest 20 percent of households in 1973 accounted for 44 percent of total U.S. income; according to the Census Bureau.

Their share jumped to 50 percent in 2002, while everyone else's fell. For the bottom fifth, the share dropped from 4.2 percent to 3.5 percent.

Jobs and the economy top the list of voter concerns this election year.

President George W. Bush touts a strong economy that is growing, but polls find that Americans have doubts and think jobs are scarce.

Sen. John Kerry is trusted more on the economy, with Democrats talking regularly of "two Americas," divided between the rich and everyone else.

That argument has merit, some private economists say.

"For those working in the bottom half of the pay scale, they're under an enormous amount of pressure," said Mark Zandi, chief economist at Economy.com.

New government data also shows that Bush's tax cuts have shifted the overall tax burden to the middle class from the wealthiest Americans.

"We're just trying to get ahead," said Debbie Reames,

49, of Raytown, Missouri, whose bank job of 24 years was outsourced in February.

"But it seems like we climb a few rungs and then we fall back again."

Reames has a new secretarial job, which pays \$7,000 a year less than her bank job, and she works catering jobs for extra money.

Her husband, Russ, can no longer work after an injury. One son is finishing college and another will start in the fall.

So the family budget tightened.

That meant fewer cable channels, more meals at home, postponed doctor appointments, missed vacations, delayed credit card payments, all to "keep the wolf away from the door," she said.

The U.S. jobs market is soft, sending wages down.

Hiring came to a near standstill last month, with companies adding just 32,000 new jobs overall, stunning economists who had expected seven times as many.

More than a million jobs have been added back to the 2.6 million lost since Bush took office, but they pay less and offer fewer benefits, such as health insurance.

The new jobs are concentrated in health care, food services, and temporary employment firms, all lower-paying industries.

Temp agencies alone account for about a fifth of all new jobs.

Three in five pay below the U.S. median hourly wage — \$13.53, said Sung Won Sohn, chief economist for Wells Fargo.

On a weekly basis, the average wage of \$525.84 is at the lowest level since October 2001.

High Rate of Black Breast Cancer Deaths Due to Poor Care, Not Genetics

A study conducted at Yale University examined why African American women die from breast cancer at a rate one-third higher than White women.

Researchers concluded that it was not due to genetics, but due to later diagnosis and lower quality treatment for Blacks than Whites.

Breast cancer is diagnosed 13% less frequently in African

American women. A study published in New England's Journal of Medicine found that many doctors treating Black patients complained they don't have the resources to adequately care for them.

African American women have a 5-year survival rate for the disease that has spread 15% (vs. 25% for White women). Source taken from: <http://www.nlm.nih.gov/med->

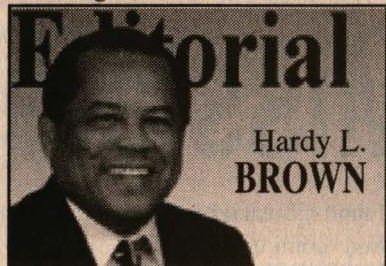
male adult with at least one gunshot wound to his upper body. The male was transported via ambulance to Riverside Community Hospital where he was pronounced deceased.

"They" Can Always Find One

Step-Parenting: One Step at a Time

In children's fairy tales stepmothers were always wicked. Remember Cinderella and her wicked stepmother? In the story of Hansel and Gretel, there was also a stepmother involved with the children being sent off into the woods to survive or die. Due to these popular fairy tales, stepmothers in reality receive a bad rap. Intuitively, children expect their father's new wife to be like the wicked witch of the West. In some cases, those suspicions are with merit.

In 1982, my first wife and the mother of my four oldest children was killed in a traffic accident, leaving me with four young motherless daughters. As an instant single father, I almost panicked. My first instinct was to find a woman, any woman, that could cook and do hair. It didn't matter how she looked or behaved as long as she could substitute as a real mother. That was a dreadful mistake. For the next several years my daughters had to endure a strange array of women.

This group of could-be second wives included a couple of borderline psychos. Finally, I decided to quit searching and become comfortable with my single parenthood situation.

Most people believe that a stepmother is going to be like the selfish fairy tale characters, but this does not have to be. The onus is on the custodial parent to use all of the wisdom God has given them before bringing a new parental figure into the lives of the children.

The majority of divorced parents remarry. Most remarriages occur within three years following divorce. Becoming a stepparent is one of the most common major life

adjustments in our society. While common, becoming a stepparent is not easy. There are no absolute guidelines for how to fill the role of being the second (or third) father or mother figure for children. The pitfalls of step-parenting are many, and how to be a good stepparent is not always obvious. It can, however, be a rewarding role for both adults and children.

In the following articles I outline many of the things to expect if you are a stepparent or about to become one. Becoming a stepparent, as a general rule, is easier when the children have had a year or more after their parents' divorce, death, or separation. Having a year or more of adjustment time allows the reality and finality of the separation of a parent to have fully set in before asking the children to adjust to a new parent figure. The children and parents will usually within a year have restructured their relationships and will have established a routine for time together. Not only does this

help the children to be ready for the addition of a stepparent; it also makes the addition of a "new" parent figure less threatening psychologically to your counterpart, the "biological" mother or father.

Many single parents rush into new relationships too fast. Within the first year, many already have a live-in lover. Unfortunately, shackling-up with children in the home is a bad, yet very common, practice. By the time the children begin to get use to the new parental figure the noncommittal relationship could be coming to an end.

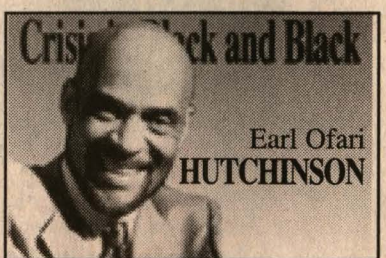

Judging Clarence Thomas

The most revealing quip in Supreme Court Justice Clarence Thomas' newly published biography *Judging Thomas* was made by Thomas' conservative high court sidekick, Antonin Scalia. He chides Thomas as a judge who is not bound by the constitutional line of authority. Loosely translated, that means that Thomas goes his own way when he makes decisions. He certainly has done that. In a memorable case in 2002, Thomas cast the lone vote against granting a stay of execution to Texas death row inmate Thomas Miller-El on the grounds that Dallas prosecutors systematically excluded Black jurors in his trial. Thomas' nonsensical vote was so far over the top and totally out of line with the overwhelming evidence of racial exclusion in the case, that even the court's other hard-line conservatives, Justices William Rehnquist and Scalia, couldn't go along with him.

However, that lone dissenting vote on a prisoner rights case was vintage Thomas. Before, during, and after his raucous Senate confirmation hearing in 1991, in which Thomas was smeared with charges that he sexually bullied Anita Hill, charges that almost torpedoed his nomination, Thomas has been the racial anti-Christ. He has waged relentless war against civil rights leaders, and liberal Democrats. He has been hailed and feted by the radical right. President Bush singled him out as one of his two favorites justices (Scalia is the other). In trying to

make sense of Thomas' doctrinaire, contrarian court votes and opinions, the simple answer is that they are payback to civil rights and civil liberties groups for trying to wreck his confirmation to the high court.

There's probably some truth to this. In an American Enterprise Institute lecture in 2001, Thomas cloaked himself in the martyr's garment and said that he expected to be treated badly for challenging liberal opinion. But it's also true that no matter how outlandish and obstructionist his votes on the court appear, Thomas is in step with the political conservatism of many whites, and the social conservatism of many Blacks.

Even as civil rights leaders grabbed headlines and the cameras for mercilessly savaging Thomas at his confirmation hearings in 1991, a parade of Blacks quietly praised Thomas' views, and backed his appointment. They were not front men on the payroll of the Heritage Foundation or other conservative think tanks.

On the eve of his confirmation hearing, a near majority of Blacks told pollsters that they were pro-life, pro-school prayer, and anti-gun control. A significant number

even opposed affirmative action programs. Polls conducted over the years by the Joint Center on Political and Economic Studies reconfirm that many Blacks share Thomas' views on social and political issues. Black parents and students at a middle school in Landover, Maryland made national news a few years ago when they battled civil rights groups who tried to scotch their invitation to Thomas to appear at their school.

Though Thomas' reflexive judicial salvos against prisoner rights keeps him in hot water with civil liberties groups, the issue of crime and punishment is a thorny one for Blacks. Polls show that a significant number of Blacks back three strikes laws, and mandatory drug sentencing laws. Their biggest volte face has been on the death penalty. In the past, Blacks were the staunchest opponents of capital punishment. The death penalty has been a vicious, blatantly racist weapon wielded by prosecutors, particularly in the South, against Blacks. But the fear of crime has softened Black opposition to the death penalty.

The issue that keeps Thomas in hot water with civil rights groups is his relentless assault on affirmative action. Thomas benefited mightily from affirmative action programs in gaining admittance to a catholic high school, Holy Cross College, and later Yale Law School. But as chair of the EEOC, and in his Supreme Court rulings, Thomas has done everything possible to obliterate affirmative

action programs. But many Blacks have also voiced strong opposition to affirmative action. They see it as insulting, demeaning, and a scarlet letter curse that implies they need the crutch of affirmative action programs to succeed in business or other professions.

White House lawyers reportedly have interviewed Thomas as a possible replacement for Supreme Court Chief Justice William Rehnquist when he retires.

If Bush is re-elected and nominates him, Thomas would be the first African-American chief justice, and at age 56, he could hold that position for decades. He could imprint his conservative view indelibly on crucial court rulings. But he'd have to be confirmed, and that would ignite another battle royal with civil rights groups, though many Blacks would be ambivalent toward his nomination. Some publicly, but many more privately, would applaud it solely because it would represent a racial first.

Thomas is a man many love to hate. But he's also a Black man who could play a major role in making and shaping law and public policy. If so, we'll be judging Thomas for a long time to come.

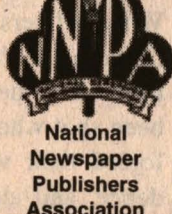
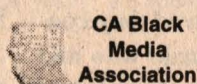

African tradition is the way of the ancient ancestors -- what they thought, felt, said, and did. Whereas Myths crystallized the beginning foundation of social unity and inter-generational communication for African tradition, early African Philosophy contained the essence of the African worldview (i.e. a unified spiritual totality). In both forms, African Tradition and philosophy have been passed on through mentorship, rites and rituals, and intense periods of education and training - first, so as to avoid cultural disorder and extinction; second, so as to honor the wisdom of the ancestors. What this means is that the content of African Tradition is those unique series of customs based upon harmony and order bursting with such significance that it carries the force of law. The theme of the ancient African worldview inside the African tradition was founded upon things of

worth (e.g. love in action) rather than on the material (e.g. money, possessions). Order, a place for everything and everything in its place, pertained to the realms of "knowing thyself;" of having the right relations with and behaviors toward fellow humans; of respecting nature; and of honoring God. Without order there would be perpetual crisis; with order, stability is ensured. Stability ("able to stand" despite turbulence) means to resist displacement or change. It implies that everything involved will continue intact with the passage of time.

For stability in spiritual matters, ancient Africans relied upon God as the standard and guide; for worldly matters, they relied upon mathematics ("the discipline which brings order to the mind"). Thus, there was never any reason to change their cultural heritage, and this is why Africans and their descendants remain a traditional people. To help the African people and their descendants know and relate to the philosophical principles of worth, order, and stability, ancient African sages did two things. First was recording these philosophical principles --

and recently copies have been found of the sacred writings of Nubians and Egyptians dating to 5300 BCE (Bynum, *The African Unconscious* p. 111). Second, they personified ("to make visible to the mind's eye") the philosophical principles into a mythological physical form called the Goddess MAAT. Being an aspect of the Egyptian goddess Aset (Isis), three of Maat's jobs were to design straightness out of chaos bring order out of confusion, and judge whether the deceased had lived a stable life of good character sufficient to warrant entering the heaven "Afterlife" (Ashby, *African Origins* p. 508, 185). For those who wandered off the path of ancient African Tradition, or for those who were forced off it (as, for example, from the effects of African American slavery) and found themselves in a cul-de-sac of self destruction, the Black Egyptian Hermes Trismegistus (?5500 BC) offered "Rebirth" as the cure. Hence, those off the path simply had to gain insight into their divine nature and then proceed down the Maat path.

In sharp contrast to this highly evolved African structure was the

Eurocentric tradition. Its focus has been about designing ways to acquire, keep, and defend against losing their ill-gotten material things. To this end, the ancient Greek Heraclitus said that conflict, not harmony, was the true and proper state for the maintenance of the good -- "strife is justice -- and war is the father of all." (Asante, *Egyptian Philosophies* p. 41). The Italian philosopher, Niccolo Machiavelli (1469-1527) laid out the blueprint of Heraclitus' teachings through the use of political cunning, intrigue, and dishonorable acts. All of these pervade today's Western values and ways. Once the Western orientation to disharmony is clearly understood, it helps explain why the Eurocentric tend to accept criminal behavior among its members as a normal part of life. Since the Afrocentric have always despised hate and evilness, the European and the African views on crime are good examples of their philosophy of life traditions in action. In short, the African tradition consists of that which is natural!

up in booming sales of luxury items. Porsche Cars North America Inc. says sales are up 17 percent for the year. Strong sales at Neiman

Marcus, Nordstrom and Saks Fifth Avenue overshadow lackluster sales at stores such as Wal-Mart, Sears and Payless Shoes.

Real estate agent Lance Anderson, 38, of Overland Park, Kan., expects a record sales year, as homeowners upgrade to more

expensive homes and commercial clients expand.

He recently took his family to Disney World for a two-week Florida vacation.

"My clientele, it seems as a whole, has seen positive growth," he said. So his family,

including three children, now eat out more often and spend more on clothes.

They recently bought two new cars and anticipate buying a larger house in the next few years.

Economists say wages should rise as companies boost hiring.

But the growing gap between the haves and have-nots will remain.

Technology has eliminated many U.S. jobs, as has global competition, particularly from low-wage countries such as China. Highly skilled, educated workers in America will thrive

as demand rises, Sohn said, while low-skilled jobs remain vulnerable to outsourcing.

"This really has nothing to do with Bush or Kerry, but more to do with the longer-term shift in the structure of the economy," Sohn said.

Time For Change, a San Bernardino transitional housing organization, is the brainchild of ex-offenders Mark and Kim Carter. Co-founder Kim says ex-offenders are systemically given misleading or wrong information. "Who gets to vote - it's the best kept secret in town. It's time to get the facts out." Time For Change plans to launch a community-wide campaign to educate and register ex-offenders.

Diane Sapp will complete her sentence and parole for a non-violent drug conviction in December. The former flood control assistant and mother, with more than a year of college, is one of a growing number of women who will sit on the sidelines come election day. "The system is a big black hole for people who need medical treatment, rehabilitation and jobs - not prison," she says. Her first offense was a misdemeanor drug conviction. She was later convicted of possessing drug paraphernalia. That second offense was elevated to a felony. Sapp said parolees can spend a lifetime dodging parole violations and prison time.

Sapp, K. Dela Garza and Constance Rosales were released from prison into Carter's structured transitional housing program called Sober Living. Rosales, a mother, waitress and former registered voter was introduced to heroine in prison. "You do your sentence - but you are still a heroine addict when you get out." Within a year, Rosales was back behind bars. "For back checks. I had to support my addiction." She says ex-offenders are rarely informed of their voting rights. "If you want the dish on voting, you get it from a fellow inmate and it's usually wrong. It's a garbage in, garbage out system of communicating."

Days before a promising job interview, Garza learned she had to return to prison for 30 days to qualify for housing and rehab funds. "It's real disappointing. The system is a revolving door that robs a person of her self esteem. In the system, voting becomes a non-pri-

ority."

An estimated 4.6 million Americans - 1 in 50 adults - are barred from voting because of a felony conviction. The number of inmates in state and federal prisons has increased more than six-fold, from less than 200,000 in 1970 to more than 1.4 million in 2002, largely due to drug prosecutions. Between 1985-95, the number of people in prison for drug offenses increased 306 percent for Whites and 707 percent for African-Americans.

1.6 million of those barred from voting are people with felony convictions who have completed their sentences.

The Fifteenth Amendment to the US Constitution, enacted in 1870 following the Civil War and the Emancipation Proclamation that declared slaves free men, outlawed voter discrimination. However, many states have sought to circumvent the Amendment by adopting restrictive voting rights.

Reform advocates say African-American communities are disproportionately affected by the disenfranchisement of criminal offenders. HRW says more than one third of the total disenfranchised population are Black men. In seven states, more than one in four African-American men are permanently disenfranchised. "Given the current rates of incarceration, three in ten of the next generation of Black men are expected to be disenfranchised at some point in their lives. In states such as Florida, where ex-felons are barred from voting for life, as many as 40 percent of Black men may permanently lose

their right to vote." Laws denying voting rights to ex-felons vary from states to state. Carter says most state laws are convoluted, "Many states misinform or make the voter restoration process so difficult many fail to participate."

California law states "voting rights are automatically restored upon completion of sentence, parole or probation." An ex-felon must register to vote. The State Board of Elections denies voter discrimination. A spokesperson said ex-felons should be informed of their voting rights at the time of their release. Election laws require ex-felons registering by mail to attach a document from the state prison system or adult parole authority stating they have completed probation or parole before they are allowed to register. Ex-felons like Rosales, Sapp and Garza feel unfairly fenced out of the voting process. "Isn't it ironic," Rosales says, "voting is the fabric of our democracy - yet the one restored right listed on my discharge papers is 'you have the right to own a firearm.'"

African Marketplace & Cultural Faire Medicine Tree Reflects Wholistic Health Practices

The Medicine Tree at the 19th Annual African Marketplace & Cultural Faire, which includes both wholistic and Western medicine, reflects the fact that people of color have always practiced wholistic medicine, as well as gone to the doctor for preventive health practices.

"I want to awaken the knowledge that resides within us that we all know how to heal ourselves wholistically -- mind, body and spirit," said Ursaline Bryant, who has served as the Director of the Wholistic Village for the past four years. "These practices are not new, unique or different. They are synonymous with the culture of who we are, which some of us have forgotten."

"We generate energy through sound, touch, thoughts, color and smell. All these things are healing. I want to make you go inside of yourself and know you can heal yourself by a thought process. I want to impart the knowledge that the things we say and think are important. They create our very existence. If I can get this info across this year, I'll be a happy camper."

The African Marketplace & Cultural Faire, the largest festival of arts, entertainment and business opportunities of the African Diaspora, will be held over three weekends in Exposition Park near the Los Angeles Sports Arena at the corner of Figueroa Street and Martin Luther King Boulevard, August 21-September 6. The Opening Gala Reception will be held on the festival site, Friday August 20th from 6:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m.

In addition to celebrating Haiti's 200th Anniversary and ten years of a free South Africa, the gala will also celebrate Ethiopia and Brazil. City

Councilman Bernard Parks, Consul General Taye Atske-Selassie of Ethiopia, Senator Diane Feinstein, Consul General Roy Young of Belize, Rev. Michael Beckwith of the Agape International Center For Truth and Consul for Political Affairs at the South African Consulate, Alan G. Moore will serve as the 2004 Honorary Ambassadors.

The Wholistic Village shares the space with Western medicine providers coordinated by Dr. Bill Releford, such as diabetes and high blood pressure screenings, intake surveys, preventive health information and health panels, as well as a farmer's market with fresh fruits, vegetables and flowers. As far as vendors, Bryant said, "We have an array of massage therapists, including reflexology of hand, ear and foot. The ear, like the foot, has every major nerve ending that corresponds to all your major organs. And when these nerve endings are stimulated, it tones and energizes your body. It's like a tonic."

"We have someone who attends Agape International Center for Truth who does Reiki energy balance, which balances the energy of the body. We will have ear coning, aromatherapy with candles and oils, yoga demonstrations, chiropractic adjustments and package salads. Vera Jarrett, who invented "Hot Scissors," a technique for cutting and sealing braids without damaging the nerve endings in your fingers, will also be in the village."

There is a nominal fee for the massages and ear coning.

Bryant said that some people are afraid when they hear the word "wholistic" because they don't know what it really means. "I'm not telling them they have to become hardcore vegetarians or vegans," she explained. "I'm saying we need plants in the home. We need colors that reflect peace and tranquility

around you."

People who work with computers have to be particularly careful, she added. "Computer energy interferes with our natural balance. No one should be on a computer more than five minutes at a time. We have to have something to intercept that energy, either magnets or supplements that you take."

Bryant also serves as manager of the African Marketplace Boutique in the Baldwin Hills/Crenshaw Mall and boutique product coordinator for both Baldwin Hills and the Fox Hills Mall boutique.

"The boutiques came about because of consignment tents at African Marketplace," Bryant explained. "A vendor from Africa had surplus products that he couldn't take back. [African Marketplace founder] James Burks took them on consignment, so the concept of the

boutiques was born."

Founded by James V. Burks, who now serves on the Board of Directors of African Marketplace, Inc., AMP is an internationally recognized celebration of the art, culture and business of the African Diaspora. It has twice been selected by the American Business Association as one of the "Top 100 Events in North America" for 1996 and 2002.

The festival has named businesswoman Debbie Thomas-Winters and filmmaker Emma E. Pullen as Co-Executive Directors.

Both Thomas-Winters and Pullen have worked with the AMP in various capacities over the past ten years. Thomas-Winters performed as a dancer for ten years, served as a vendor for two years and worked in administration for three years, including serving as the Volunteer

Coordinator.

Pullen created the first AMP Koumen Kele Short Film Festival, produced the Opening Gala Reception for 5 years, produced the 2003 Youth Village and provided marketing and publicity over several years.

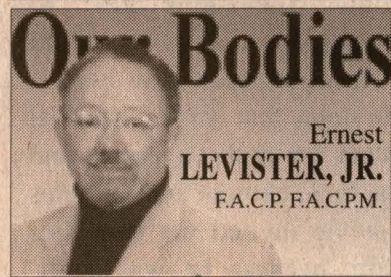
A special Youth Day will occur on Friday, August 27, with free admission to the festival for youth, senior citizens and people of all ages who are young at heart.

Dear Dr. Levister: I am an African-American nurse. Many patients who are diagnosed with lupus are under the false impression that this disease runs only in families. Please shed some light on this little known illness.

Dear L.T. Unfortunately when it comes to the headlines, lupus usually takes a back seat to the more wide-spread problems of heart disease, cancer, and stroke. However, lupus is a growing problem among women, particularly black females. Lupus (its full medical name is

Women, Blacks More Likely To Suffer From Lupus

Systemic Lupus Erythematosus) is a mysterious illness. Although various aspects of it were described as far back as 1840, the cause is still unknown and a cure still elusive.

Until the 1970's, lupus was little known to the public. It's not a surprise that even today lupus is not listed in many mainstream health guides. Like AIDS, lupus involves the immune system, but there the similarity ends. Lupus is not transmissible from one individual to another. It does not appear to run in families, though genetic factors that predispose some people to the disease are surfacing. In the majority of patients, it does not prove fatal. The illness can be difficult to diagnose. Women are five times more likely than men to die from

lupus, and Black patients are three times more likely than white patients to die from the disease in part because of problems in gaining access to quality health care.

Lupus is a battle of the body against itself. Lupus turns the body's immune system against its own healthy tissues, in some cases attacking blood vessels and other tissue in the kidneys, brain and other vital organs. Many afflicted people also develop severe arthritis.

In reporting the results of a 20-year study, lupus expert Charles G. Helmick, MD, said at least eight-of-nine lupus sufferers are women, most of them young at the time the disease strikes. There is an estimated 500,000 to one million

Americans with the illness. Lupus is not an officially reportable condition as are tuberculosis, measles AIDS and so on, as a result patient data is often difficult to find.

Health officials have long known that lupus strikes women, particularly those of childbearing age, more often than men. Scientists are therefore studying whether hormone imbalances may contribute. Most patients never face a major crisis; they simply cope, day to day, with problems such as rashes, fatigue and severe joint discomfort. Contact your physician about ways to control the disease, prevent complications and ease the impact of lupus.

Jim McGreevey's Promiscuity And The APA

If New Jersey Governor Jim McGreevey is telling us the truth, he has committed two serious sexual sins against God and his wife: Adultery and Sodomy. As a professing Catholic, McGreevey should understand the grave nature of these sinful activities in the eyes of the church. But, apparently, he does not. He has now carefully positioned himself as a "victim" in this incident.

In his announcement that he was resigning in November over recent revelations of what he calls a "consensual" affair with Golan Sipel, he proudly declared that he was a "Gay American." His second wife stood by his side as he unashamedly announced this to the world. Where there should have been repentance for betraying his wife, he only displayed pride.

McGreevey's admission of this affair is undoubtedly not the full truth. In fact, his accuser has now publicly stated that he is straight and was a victim of McGreevey's unwanted homosexual advances. The truth will have to be sought out by aggressive journalists, or in a court of law.

McGreevey's closeted homosexuality or bisexuality has been rumored for years in New Jersey politics, yet was never vigorously pursued by the liberal

mainstream media. One can only surmise how many other homosexual relationships he has engaged in over the years-while maintaining the façade of a churchgoer and happily married family man. We can be sure that his homosexual attraction to Golan Sipel was not his first promiscuous encounter. He was apparently willing to put his wife at risk of acquiring an incurable STD or AIDS as part of his homosexual adulterous affairs.

Last week, the Traditional Values Coalition issued a call to the New Jersey legislature to reconsider passage of a homosexual domestic partnership law in view of McGreevey's clear conflict of interest in pushing this legislation. New Jerseyans deserve another vote on this law that is free of McGreevey's hidden sexual agenda.

The governor's announcement that he is a "Gay American," is a tribute to the success of homosexual activists in convincing millions of Americans that homosexuality is a fixed identity, not a psychological condition that should be treated and cured. Much of the blame for this misinformation comes from the American Psychiatric Association, which was subverted from the inside and attacked from the outside in the early 1970s by homosexual activists.

The removal of homosexuality as a mental disorder from the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders in 1973 was accomplished by

closeted homosexuals inside the group and by harassment tactics instigated by radical homosexual organizations on the outside. The removal of homosexuality from the DSM was not done for scientific reasons; it was done to appease homosexual activists. The entire history of this medical malpractice is grimly detailed in Dr. Ronald Bayer's book, "Homosexuality and American Psychiatry: The Politics of Diagnosis."

It is actually the greater crime against individuals struggling with abnormal same-sex attractions. It's important that McGreevey genuinely repent of his sins against his wife, but it's also time for the APA to reverse its ideological, politically-based decision of 1973 and realize that thousands of people have overcome their gender identity conflicts.

The Olympic games are a sports junkie's heaven. Three weeks of continuous action featuring the greatest athletes in the world competing against each other. But, pause for a moment and think about the road traveled by these great athletes to reach the world's greatest stage.

Holyfield USA's founder and director, Keith Rucker knows the hardships endured by world class athletes and has made it his life's work to help them achieve their goal. With the financial backing of the former Olympian and Heavyweight Champion of the world, 28-year-old Rucker, has crafted Holyfield USA into a beacon of hope for those without the means to pursue Olympic dreams. Rucker's mission is simple. "We want to develop Olympians".

Becoming a professional in any sport is a difficult and challenging endeavor. No sport more so than track and field/ Baseball, basketball and football

players typically travel a predetermined path throughout their high school and college development. At the end of that path, they are drafted into the professional ranks and awarded lucrative contracts, assuring their financial futures.

Athletes participating in the individual sports like tennis, golf and track and field travel a different road. This requires huge developmental investments to position themselves for the great rewards. Tennis and golf however, have a slight advantage over Track and Field. These athletes typically come from a narrower socioeconomic spectrum, one more affluent with more available resources to acquire the needed training and facilities to maximize their success. Track and field draws its athletes from the entire socioeconomic spectrum and yet success requires huge financial investments in training and facilities to advance in the sport.

Without sponsorship an athlete has little chance of rising to the Olympic level.

Yet, Track and Field athletes nearly always need to achieve Olympic dominance in order to garner the kinds of monetary rewards needed to secure one's future. Many promising track and field athletes never reach their potential simply because the personal investment required is too high.

Rucker, a tall, youthful looking young man who could easily be confused with one of his athletes can always be found trackside whenever his athletes are competing. He is easy to spot, just watch any Holyfield USA athlete after their event. They will lead you directly to Keith, counseling and offering encouragement after each event.

Rucker, a caseworker in Atlanta foster kids program and a youth coach formed a special bond with the former champ during his youth coaching years. Several of Holyfield's kids were members of Rucker's Quicksilver track clubs. There, Rucker and Holyfield found many hours to engage in deep discussions. It was also during these years that the Champ came to know and develop his absolute admiration and trust in Rucker. "Mr. Holyfield told me on many occasions that I would go far in life no matter what I decided to do", said Rucker.

It was Holyfield himself who urged Rucker to pursue a greater challenge in life. "One day he asked me, What is it that you would like to do in life? I had no answer". Fortunately, Holyfield would pose that question to Rucker many more times. Over the next few years, Rucker and Holyfield would have many discussions about the future. "I still had no answer, but I knew that there were great athletes like Milton Campbell with no sponsor and I have always wanted to work with professional athletes".

"Finally, one day I told Mr. Holyfield that this is what I wanted to do, help athletes reach the Olympics. Mr. Holyfield said, if that's what you want to do put it together and we'll do it."

The program helps athlete with every aspect of their professional development. It provides finan-

cial support and removes those obstacles that prevent the athletes from focusing their complete attention toward reaching the Olympics.

"Without Keith and the program I don't know how I would make it. I'd have to try and come out of my own pocket, I guess," said Robbie Hughes who will compete in the 110-meter hurdles in Athens.

Hughes is just one of several Holyfield USA athletes favored to medal in Athens, including Jebreh Harris (800 m), Micah Harris (110 hurdles) Milton Campbell (400 m), and Labronze Garnett (400 m hurdles) and several others.

Holyfield USA currently has 13 athletes in the program. "Our goal is to have 40 athletes, 20 male and 20 female. We take athletes from any area of the country. They don't have to live in Atlanta. We have athletes from all over America.

Rucker allows his athletes to work with their own coaches at their home locations. They plan and submit meet schedules and travel requirements directly to him. He guides them along away. "There are always problems to solve, my phone rings all night long. I am constantly on the phone with athletes about something." It could be a missed flight or lost pair of track shoes, whatever the particular problem, Rucker is there to help mitigate the problem and allow the athletes to get their attention back on their goals.

Rucker's program acceptance requirements are simple. "We first determine whether an athlete is good enough. At that point the athlete must commit to the shared goal of continually improving their performance. Its up to them (after acceptance into the program). They must take full advantage of the equipment, shoes and cost offsets that we provide. We do as much as we can," continued Rucker.

"Mr. Holyfield has been a great mentor to me. I have been blessed having him believe in me and give me this great opportunity. I try to do the same with our athletes. They are all required to have some community involvement to whatever extent possible. They are also required to conduct themselves with the highest regard for the sport. "I tell them, there is no Mr. Nike or Mr. Adidas out there, but there is a Mr. Holyfield and he has always been known as a gracious and humble champion, and that's what we want to be."

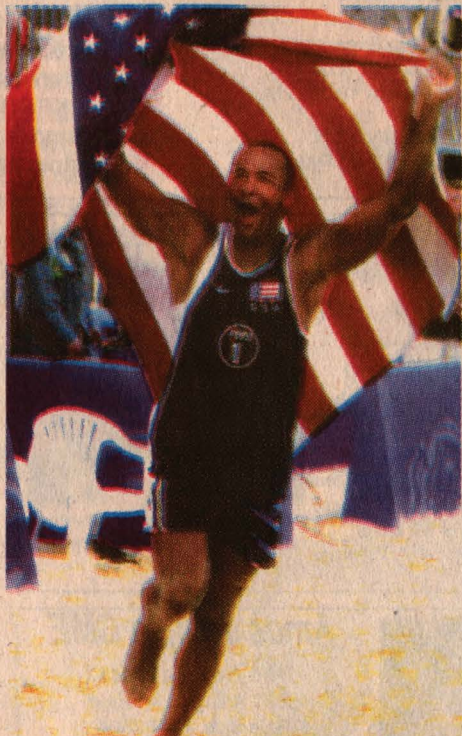
Rucker's Holyfield USA athletes are expected to do well in Athens and bring home a trove of medals. No matter what their final medal count you can be assured that they will compete hard and make all of America proud.

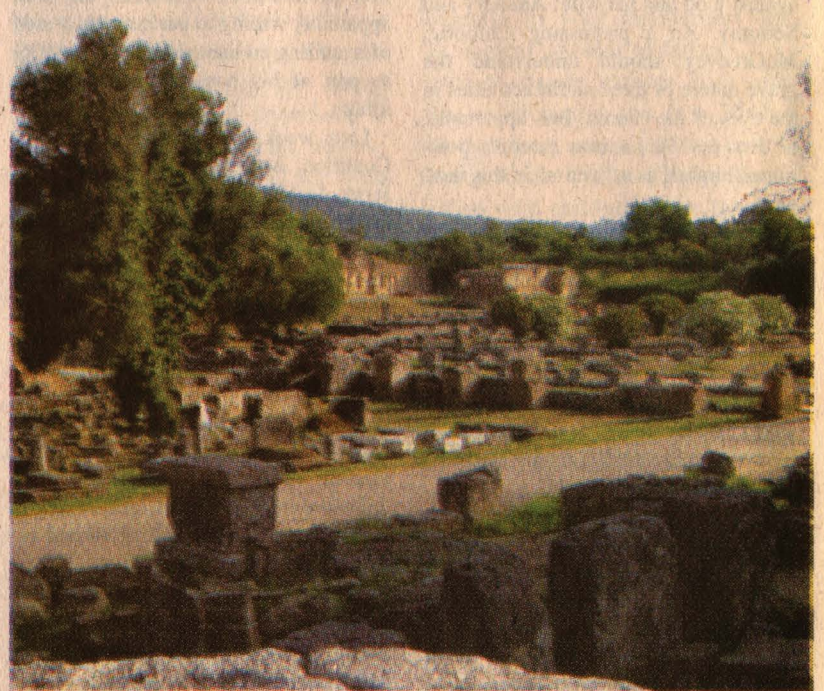
Olympic Champion Marion Jones returns to the games after having her first child.

The Greek Diaspora across the globe has not only been a human movement, but also the movement and evolution of the Olympic Games.

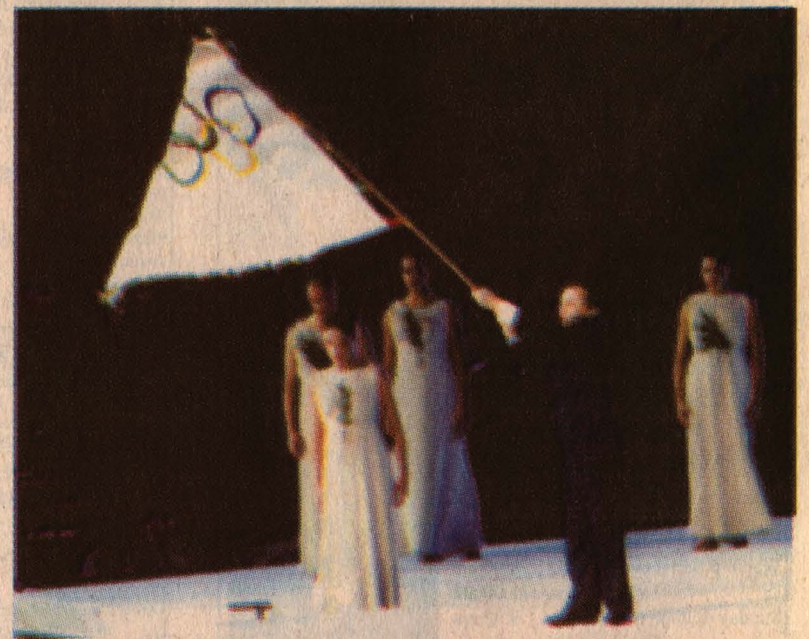
I also returned to Greece this summer, finding myself in a country that has taken a large step into the future, all the while keeping one foot planted firmly in the past.

This past I speak of can be seen first hand in Olympia, the birth place of the Games. Surrounded by olive orchards and nestled in a peaceful valley where the Alpheios and Kladeos rivers meet, the ruins of Olympia stand as living history.

If you listen closely you can hear the voices and footsteps of pilgrims and athletes.

Feasts in honor of Olympian Zeus would mark the opening of the Olympiads. The first day was reserved for athletic contests. On the second day a herald proclaimed the names of the participants in the chariot races, horse races and pentathlon, all of which were scheduled for the following day. On the fourth day young men competed at running unencumbered, running in full armor, the high jump, boxing, wrestling and pankration (a brutal combination of the two). The games culminated on the fifth day with sacrifices and, in the evening, a banquet for the victors, who wore crowns of olive leaves.

The history of the Olympic Games does not only speak to Greeks; it speaks to all of humanity, listen, can you hear it?

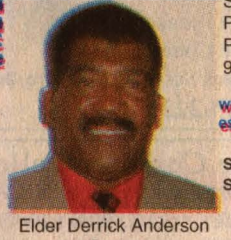

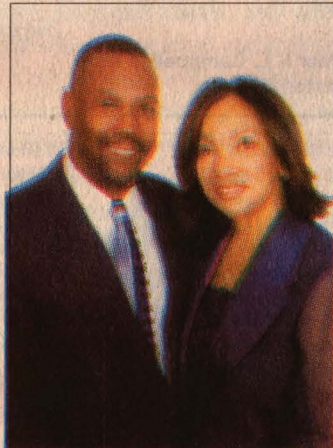

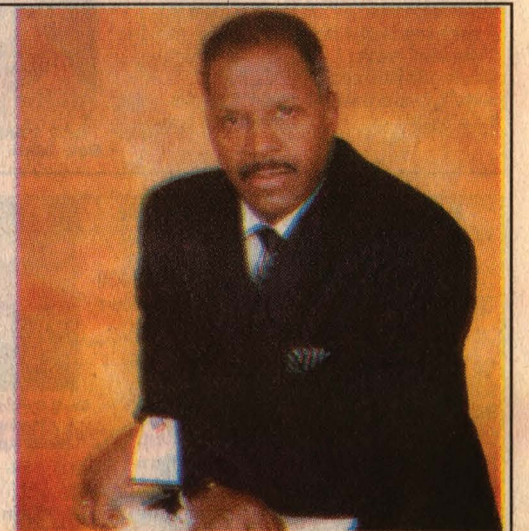

Dear Claire,

I think I have a problem! I am a 24 year old college senior. I am very attractive, not only to myself but to men as well, (they are constantly telling me so). Anyway, I often date 5 or 6 times a week and each time it is a different date with a different man. Most of the guys are pretty nice and I start out really wanting to get to know them better. However, my problem is this, I love the pre-dating moments that lead up to intimacy, however, once that occurs, I am no longer interested in anything about them. I cannot explain this attitude of mine and I do not want to be this way. I would like to be in a committed relationship with a man that I really care about. Could you please shed some light on my situation? Do I have a mental disorder? How can I stop this bad behavior before it destroys me and possibly someone else?

Love, Relationship & Daily Life Advice

Dear No Longer Interested,

I wouldn't necessarily call your behavior a "mental disorder" however, you are in need of some self-exploration, positive esteem building and some behavior modification. You can start by evaluating what makes you do this? Is it something that the man expects from you? Is it something that you expect of yourself? Where have you learned this behavior? What does this behavior get for you? etc... Write down the answers to this evaluation as well as your feelings while you are focusing on this issue (keep a journal).

In addition to self-exploration, you will want to try a behavior strategy. For example, write down a plan. Start with short time periods. For thirty (30) days you are going to abstain from being intimate with any of your dates and you will attempt to cultivate a relationship/friendship that would include talking about their philosophies on life, political issues, life goals, past history, etc...

Since the thrill of dating is very satisfying to you, as you have stated, and since you enjoy those "pre-dating moments" you can make those moments last longer—weeks longer, if you so choose to.

In addition to sharing meaningful conversation with these men, you can also share dinner, movies, plays, concerts, walks on the beach, etc...hence, allowing those dating moments to continue while attempting to cultivate a relationship/friendship without sex. You have control in this situation. Repeat to yourself... "I will break this pattern and since I do want to have a significant, committed relationship—I need to conduct myself differently."

During the thirty- (30) day period, write down your observations and feelings. Be willing to extend the time period for another thirty days. Continue your daily journal of feelings and thoughts. It would also be important, at some point in time to verbally share with these men your situation. Who knows, you may get support and encouragement! Remember you are much more important than just intimacy---and so are they.

Good Luck---after you try this behavior strategy approach, write to me again and let me know how you are doing... Take Care!

Ask your friend to define "relationship" for you

Hi Claire,

I have a question for you. There is this guy that I am a best friend with. We have been pretty much best friends for about 6 years. We do just about everything together and we always have the greatest time. I have expressed my desire for him to possibly become my boyfriend but he always says that he's not ready for a relationship. However, he is constantly expressing his desire to be intimate. Well, against my better judgement, I gave in. I thought that maybe this might change his mind and he would want to have a relationship with me, however, he still just wants to remain "good friends." Only now, we are good friends that are continuously intimate. This upsets me greatly and I don't feel as though I can hang out with him after this. I still want to be friends with him, but I don't know how to keep my feelings in check. Can you give me some suggestions?

Well, my friend,

As you are aware you and your friend have crossed the best friend line and have added another component/dynamic to the relationship, which usually does complicate things. Your male friend has not verbally expressed a change in the relationship, but has physically allowed the change to occur. I don't think it is wise to be intimate with a man who can not admit verbally his feelings regarding this change in status. Your communication with him should be enhanced to prevent yourself from being hurt in the future and to better understand him. It appears that he verbally denies being ready for a relationship, however, he is already in a relationship, with you!

This is very confusing and you need to communicate your feelings verbally and create a situation in which he can share his feelings with you as well. You don't have to be a nag or so forceful in your communication process---but plant the little seeds of communication. For example, "Let's talk about us..." or "you are such a great boyfriend..." Ask your friend to define "relationship" for you--to get some definition/clarification. With questions like these, maybe you will gain a better understanding of where you stand with him. Also, you must evaluate yourself--Is this something that you can live with? If so, then you will continue to accept him and his non-commitment, which may eventually cause you a great deal of emotional pain. It is really your call!

The two-day festival runs from 1:00 to 9:00 p.m. each day at Fairmount Park, one of California's oldest historic parks founded in 1870. The September 25 line up includes the legendary guitarist Peter White, the Braxton Brothers and Marcus Johnson. The September 26 line up includes Grammy nominated saxophonists Kirk Whalum, Doc Powell and L.A. Mambo Combo. "More smooth jazz artists will be announced soon," said Tiffany Jones, president of OneSource Marketing, Inc. and jazz festival executive producer.

for General Admission and VIP ticket holders. Tickets can be purchased and printed online at www.riversidejazzfestival.com or by calling the box office at 951.780.8880.

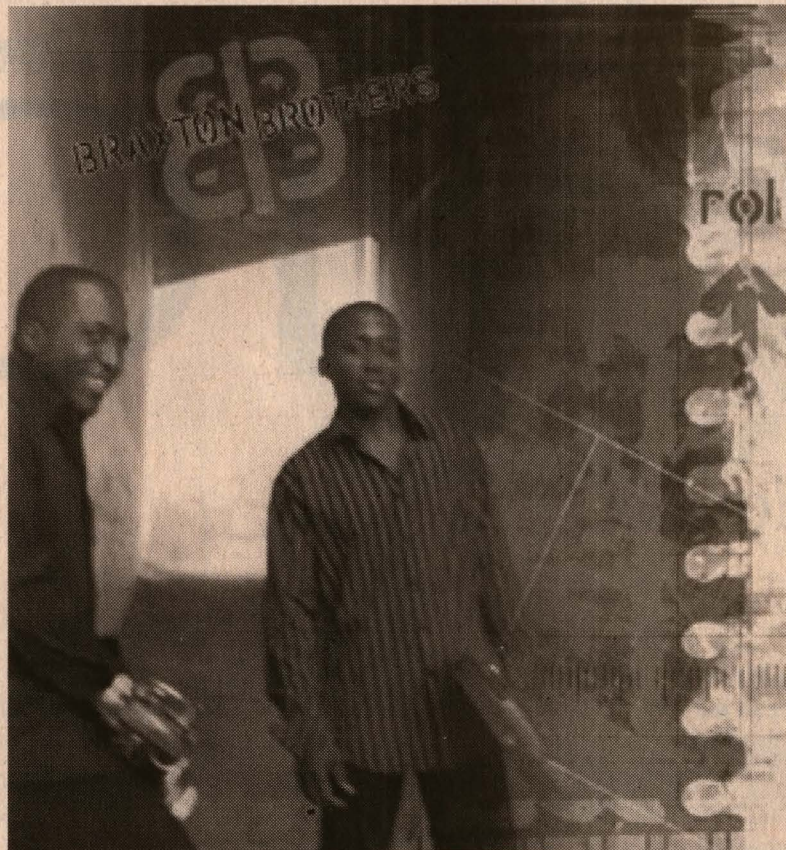
The late 1980's and early 1990's saw Kirk Whalum recording and performing with Nancy Wilson, Al Jarreau, Luther Vandross, Barbara Streisand, Quincy Jones and others. He recorded on movie soundtracks *Boyz N the Hood*, *Grand Canyon*, *The Prince of Tides* and Whitney Houston's 1993 release, *The Bodyguard*.

In 1974, at the age of 20, Peter White started playing guitar and

keyboards with Al Stewart, the famous Scottish folk singer. In 1987, he played guitar for artist Basia on her multi-platinum debut, *Time and Tide*. In 1988, White launched his solo career. Since then he has collaborated with numerous other artists including Boney James, Richard Elliot, Janis Ian (At Seventeen), Dave Koz, Gerald Albright, and

most notably, Grover Washington, Jr., who passed away in 1999.

"The Riverside Jazz Festival is a project that we've been exploring and planning for almost two years. Our research indicated that there is a need for more quality entertainment in the Inland Empire. Also, it is time to bring a jazz festival back to Riverside," said Jones.

The main festival grounds are surrounded by Fairmount Park's

historic band shell, Lake Fairmount, the boathouse and picnic area with easy access to food and speciality retail booths. They include a food pavilion, beverage stations and arts and crafts dealers. "The festival still seeks vendors to join the two-day festival," said Jones.

While the City of Riverside is a sponsor of the Riverside Jazz Festival, "The city's help is limited because it doesn't have the resources or know-how to do

anything more at this time," said Riverside Councilman Dom Betro. "She's really taken all the risks," Betro said of Jones' dedication to the project. "Ms. Jones is plugging away at it."

The City Park and Recreation Department is doing its part to spruce up Fairmount Park. "We are trimming trees, painting the band shell, refurbishing and painting benches and picnic tables, planting new grass, and cleaning all over the park, especially on the east end near the band shell," said Robin Metz, Recreation Superintendent for Riverside City Park and Recreation Department.

"We have had ongoing efforts to clean up and rehabilitate the park for the last year, but since the new Park Superintendent, Shirley Bennett, started six months ago we have really hastened the pace of improvements," said Metz.

"We expect this jazz festival to be a fun and exciting weekend for everyone in attendance. We are especially grateful to the City of Riverside for their support and sponsorship of the Riverside Jazz Festival. As a jazz fan, event producer and resident of Riverside, I want this event to bring together people of all ages and diverse cultures. Also, as a proud resident of Riverside, I want to showcase the beauty and heritage of our city," said Jones.

Legendary Harlem Globetrotter Celebrates 72nd Birthday

J.C. Gipson

The City of Highland's most illustrious resident, J.C. Gipson, recently celebrated his 72nd birthday at the Crescent City Creole Restaurant in Montclair (one of his favorite places to dine out), accompanied by Nori LeFay-Harrison, whom he playfully refers to as "The Book Lady," because she's writing his biography, and Joyce Travis-Greathouse (Nori's personal assistant, as well as J.C.'s press agent). In Europe, Joyce worked as a fashion model.

After a delectable lunch of crabcakes, chicken, and shrimp, the restaurant staff brought out a birthday cake lit with candles for the former Harlem Globetrotter to make a wish and blowout. In unison, the restaurant staff gathered around the table and sang a jazzy birthday song for J.C.'s special day, and afterwards everyone clapped, including many of the customers dining at nearby tables.

Gipson, also known as "The Big Gip," had a glorious basket-

ball career for twenty seasons, spanning from 1952 to 1972. The Los Angeles native personified the image of a Globetrotter with strong, superb playing ability and an outstanding flair for showmanship. He was loved by children of all ages, and was a remarkable Global Ambassador. He established a "World Series

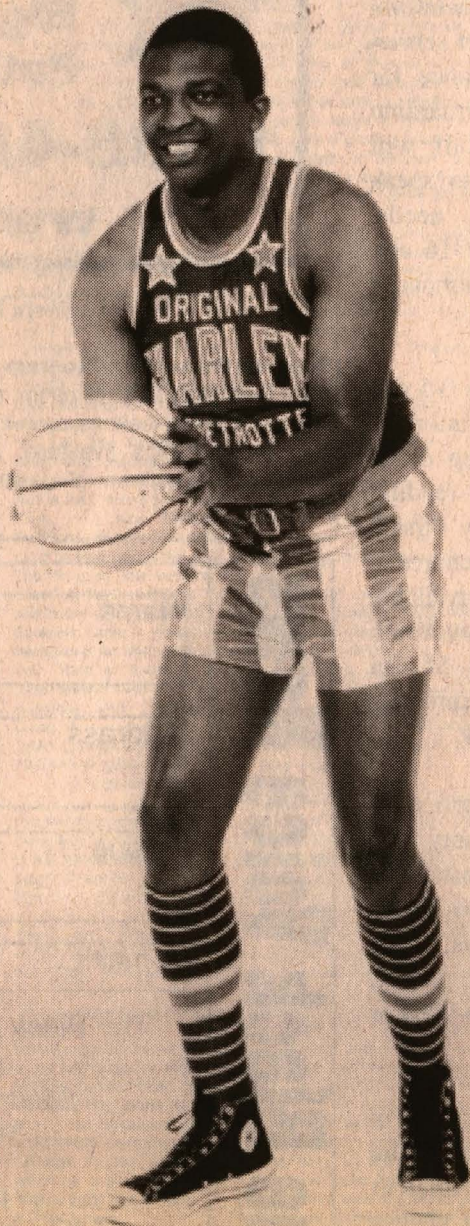
of Basketball" record by tallying 33 points against the 1953 College All-Americans in Chicago, Illinois.

Before there was Wilt Chamberlain (J.C. Gipson's roommate), J.C. was the tallest basketball player the Globetrotters team had, towering over other men at six foot, eight inches tall, and

weighing as much as 240 pounds. When Chamberlain came aboard (standing a whole head taller than J.C.), the two of them made formidable opponents on the basketball court.

J.C. is still a valuable member of the Globetrotters organization, because of his good nature, his great showmanship and his

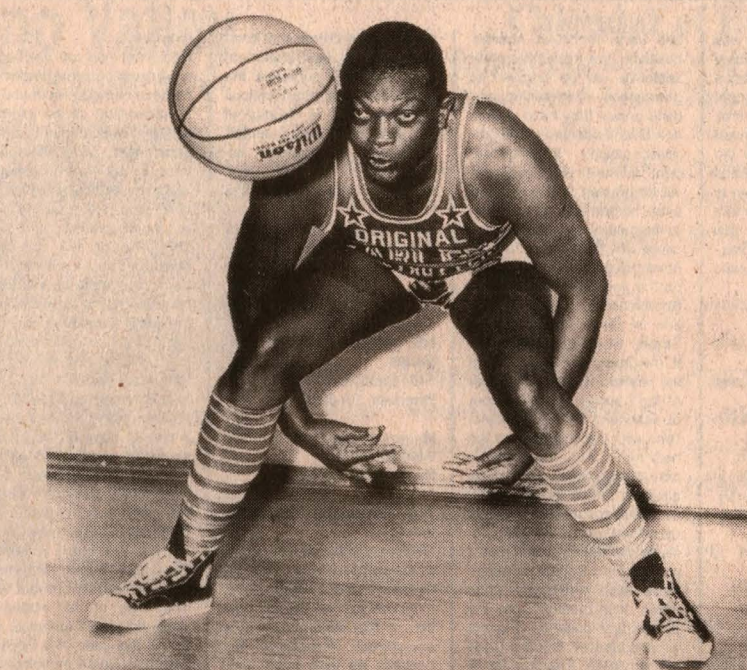
role as a friendly giant. Jerry Saperstein (the son of Abe Saperstein, the original owner of the Harlem Globetrotters) is being considered for Gipson's biography, with a projected completion date of Spring 2005. Included in his biography are the experiences of his family, friends, and former teammates such as Charles Harrison, John Kline, Hubert Ausbie, Robert Hall, Marques Haynes, Meadowlark Lemon and his best friend, "the Ray Charles," who recently died.

In the 1950s, Gipson's mother owned and operated the "Gipson Cafe" in Los Angeles. J.C. graduated from Jefferson High School in Los Angeles, giving up the opportunity to go to college he joined the unique playing-style of the Globetrotters team. He has played and entertained crowds of fans in 87 countries around the world.

Gipson, and his fellow teammates, Meadowlark Lemon, Curly Neal, Geese Ausbie, Pablo Robinson and Bobby Joe Mason, who were featured in the Hanna-Barbera cartoon series, feel that it was fun to be pictured on television; but, they also realize that their collective fame is really based on the actual games they played, on the efforts of other great teammates, and on the talented Harlem Globetrotters organization behind them.

Since the start of the Harlem Globetrotters Professional

Basketball Team in 1927, there have been 600 extraordinary players, but only 70 of them have been fortunate enough to make it into the Hall of Fame, and 20 of them are still living legends. Gipson is one of them. Currently, Gipson spends his days as a guest speaker, visiting local schools, encouraging our youth to abstain from self-destructive behavior. And, he plans to enroll at San Bernardino Valley College next



year, making him the most famous student the school has ever had



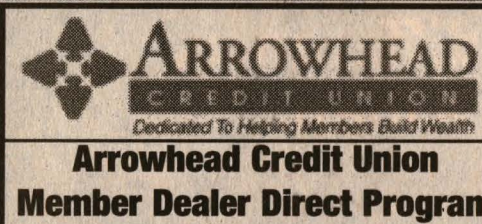

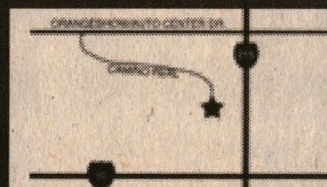
