### COLLEGE COMMUNITY CAN VOLUNTEER WORK

Members of the college community may volunteer time to assist colleagues whose homes were destroyed in the fire. Workers are needed to help fill and stack sand bags and to help clear the debris from residential lots. Anyone wishing to volunteer such services may call Jeanne Hogenson in Activities, ext. 7407, to put their names on a list.

Fire victims who need such assistance can retrieve names from the list and contact volunteers.

Because the fire burned off vegetation, there is concern that the rainy season will bring flooding and mud slides to the fire-ravaged neighborhoods. Reseeding has begun, but some time between seeding and the rains must elapse if the effort is to be of any value. To stave off further destruction, homeowners in northern San Bernardino have begun walling their neighborhoods with sand bags.

### ACTIVITIES DESIGNATED FIRE-AID CLEARING HOUSE

The Activities Office has been designated the campus clearing house for offers of and requests for housing and furnishings for victims of the fire. Jeanne Hogenson, ext. 7407, will take calls from anyone wishing to make such offers and match them up with inquiries from victims seeking such assistance.

Two offers of housing have been received already, one a rental in San Bernardino and, the other, free housing near Victor Valley College. The Activities Office will keep a record of such calls and, when requests for assistance are received, put the donor and the victim in touch with each other.

In addition to housing, the clearing house will maintain lists of those willing to donate or loan household materials, especially items like beds and dressers.

Anyone knowing of a third party who has household items or housing may also contact Ms. Hogenson.
