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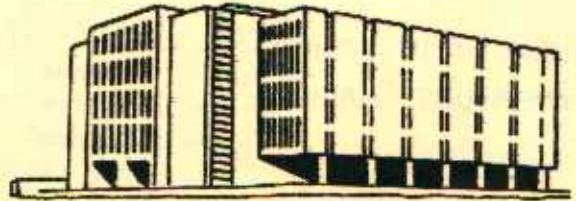

REDUCED WORKTIME SURVEY RESULTS IN

Personnel wishing to see the results of the Chancellor's Office survey on employee interest in voluntarily reducing worktime can read one of the copies available in the Personnel Office or Library.

Roughly half the 20,509 full-time, permanent employees who received the questionnaire responded. A total of 214 of the 365 Cal State, San Bernardino employees completed the questionnaire.

The summary breaks down answers into three main categories: employee interest in voluntarily working less than full time, interest in voluntarily reducing worktime as a means of avoiding layoffs, and preferred methods for such a reduction. It further categorizes responses according to age, sex and occupation of employees. Pay would be reduced in proportion to reduction in hours.

The results show 35.9 percent of the CSUC employees responding were interested in voluntarily working less than full time. About 56.5 percent were interested in doing so as a means of avoiding layoffs.

Asked which form of reduced worktime they would prefer, the largest percentage of non-teaching employees, 50 percent, said they would like fewer days a week. Among instructional faculty, the largest percentage, 39 percent, favored fewer terms per year.

SUMMER SCHOOL IS ALMOST OVER
