Riverside Crime Stats Down In Major Categories

Riverside Police Department 2007 year-end statistics reported to the California Department of Justice an 8.64% drop in overall serious crime compared to statistics filed for the previous year.

Among the highlights are 16% drop in robberies, a 23% drop in auto thefts and 29% drop in commercial burglaries.

The reported murder rate of 12 for 2007, a 9% increase, includes 11 homicide cases and one manslaughter case. Riverside reported 11 homicides in 2006.

The clearance rate of cases with sufficient information to complete an investigation increased in all categories over the previous year.

In its Strategic Plan, the Riverside Police Department promotes the philosophy of the police, city government and community members at large working together as "co-producers of public safety" to achieve reductions in crime and improve public safety and quality of life.

"Diligent work of our officers and detectives, together with concerned members of the community, have helped us reduce crime and increase the successful investigation rate of crimes that do occur," said Chief of Police Russ Leach.

Chief's Community- Police Partnership Summit

Riverside Chief of Police Russ Leach will address the community at the Chief's Community-Police Partnership Summit - a town hall meeting to brief the community on progress mid-way through the Strategic Plan 2004-2009, and to hear input and answer questions from members of the public.

"We consulted with the community when we created the Strategic Plan and we want to report and receive feedback on how we've been doing," Chief Leach said. All interested Riverside residents are invited to attend.

The Strategic Plan was developed to guide the Riverside Police Department through the period following a five-year Stipulated Judgment for department reforms under state supervision, which expired in April 2006.

The Chief will introduce the current Command Staff, the 2007 Chief's Report published last year, present an update on the Strategic Plan and innovative programs RPD has undertaken, and he will take comments and questions from the public.

The meeting will be held at California Baptist University, 8432 Magnolia Ave., Riverside, from 7-9 p.m., on Wednesday, February 20.

"A component of the Strategic Plan identifies a triad partnership of Police,

Columbia.

Cheered on by a roaring crowd in Wisconsin, next stop in the Democratic nomination battle Obama told some 18,000 supporters, there's still a lot of work to do.

"This movement won't stop until there's change in Washington. Tonight we're on our way."

In Tuesday's contests, Obama showed impressive strength among not only the

groups that have backed him in earlier contests - Blacks, younger voters, the affluent and independents - but also among white and Hispanic men in the heart of America's

DEFENSE FILES MOTION TO UNSEAL SEARCH WARRANT

Rialto Officer Shooting Shrouded In Secrecy

What happened in the early morning hours of Thursday, October 18, 2007 when Rialto SWAT officer Sergio Carrera Jr. was fatally shot in the head? The shooting occurred during a struggle while he and three other Rialto and Colton SWAT officers were serving a search warrant as part of an investigation into suspected drug houses.

What transpired in the immediate aftermath of the shooting incident during the

so-called roundtable proceedings held inside a detective-area headquarters? This is supposed to provide a timely and preliminary review; Why did authorities rush to clear the officers involved? Was there probable cause to issue a search warrant to raid the home of 32-year-old Kris Antonio Wiggins?

Four days after the shooting at a news conference San Bernardino County District Attorney Michael A. Ramos flanked by more than 40 uniformed Rialto police officers, charged Wiggins with Carrera's murder.

Wiggins' defense lawyers Salvador Silva and Michael J. Holmes claim critical facts

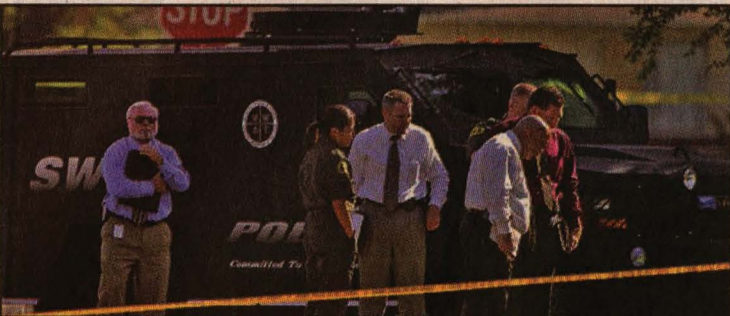
surrounding the shooting remain shrouded in a cloak of secrecy.

"Was this an accidental officer-on-officer shooting? Why was the search warrant against Wiggins filed under seal? Why did prosecutors rush to dismiss witness claims of "friendly fire", when there were still forensics out and witnesses who needed to be interviewed?" Silva said during an interview Sunday.

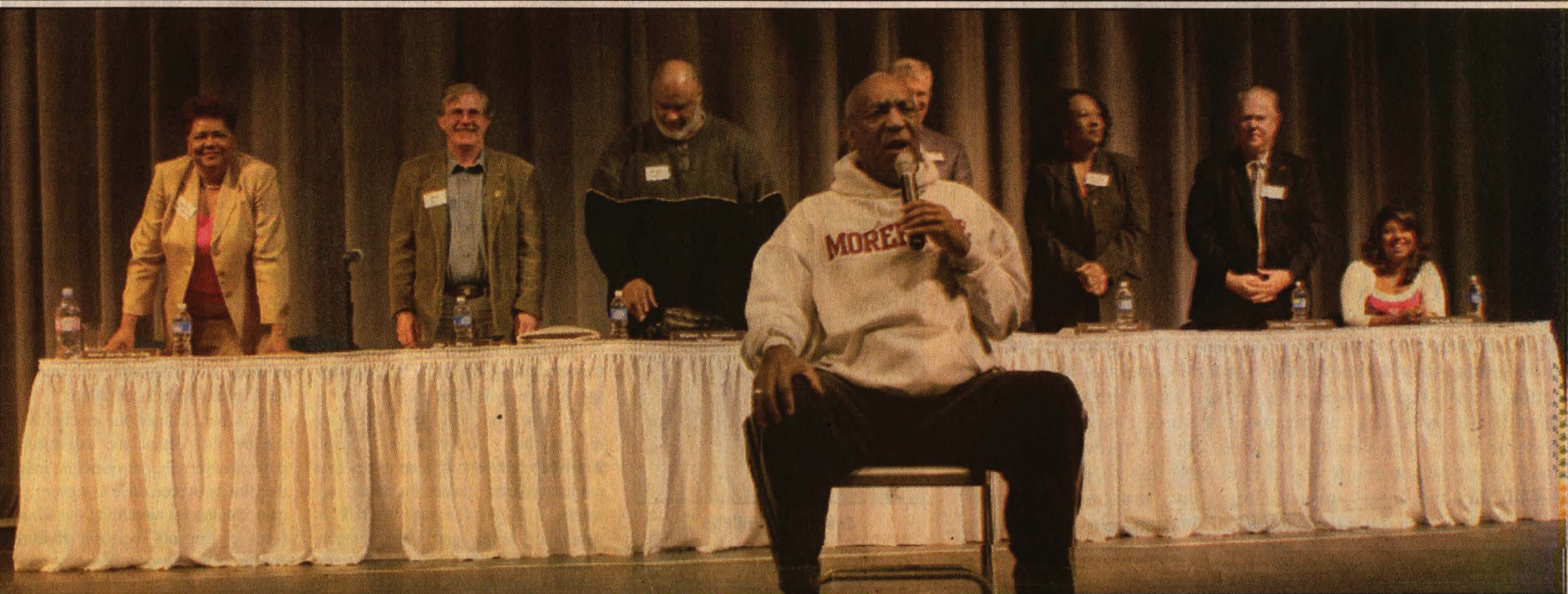
Silva wants the warrant unsealed and the officers, who were on the scene when Carrera was shot to testify at Wiggins' upcoming preliminary hearing.

"We plan to file a motion to unseal the

Cosby takes Over Carter High

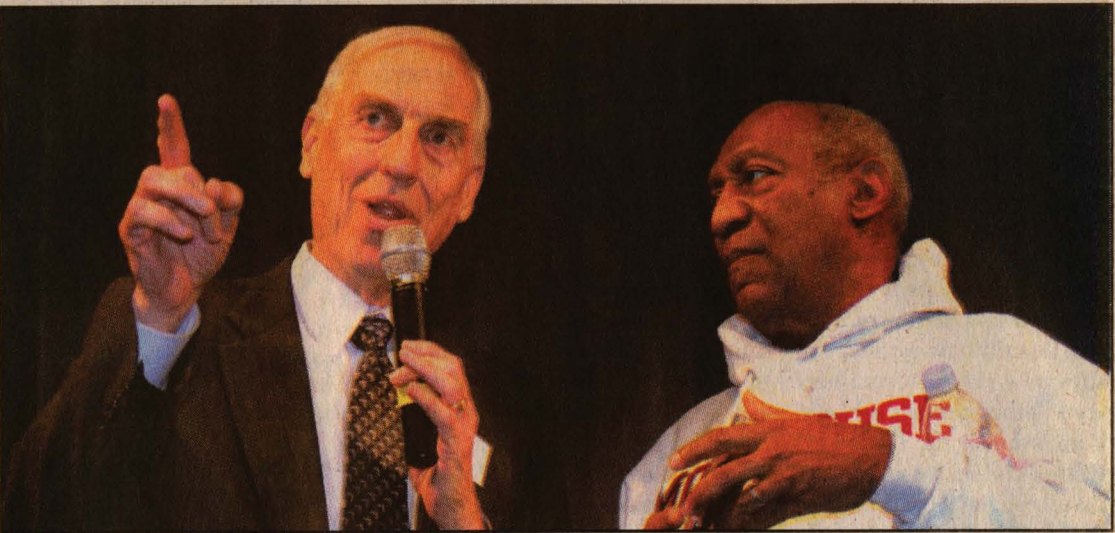

Bill Cosby Ed.D took over Carter High School as he admonished parents to "parent". And youth not to grow up too soon, experiencing grown up things such as sex. "Remember mantra," he said over and over again. "How many of you remember 'over my dead body'? Parents don't say that anymore--but they should," he told a huge crowd, far from the intimate group he requested.

In her telephone invitation a few days prior to his visit, Superintendent Edna Herring said, "mum is the word. Mr. Cosby doesn't want fanfare, he just wants an intimate group of parents and students." The crowd grew and the auditorium was busseling with students, parents, grandparents, elected officials and news reporters. They heard Cosby verbally beat up parents and their children and other adults, teachers and school board members. "If you don't like children get off the

They are wealthy, powerful, and untouchable. They can do anything. They can go anywhere. They'reSuper Delegates! Julian Bond, Maxine Waters, Donna Brazile, Dorothy Height, Barbara Boxer, Willie Brown.

Democrats have 796 of them, and if the race for the White House remains as

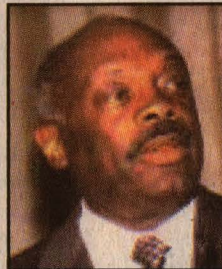
close as it is now between Sens. Barack Obama and Hillary Rodham Clinton, these "super delegates" - elected officials and party stakeholders who can back any candidate - could decide the next Democratic nominee.

Think those delegates being elected in all those primaries and caucuses choose the next candidate for their perspective parties - think again - yes if you are a Republican, but not if you are a Democrat.

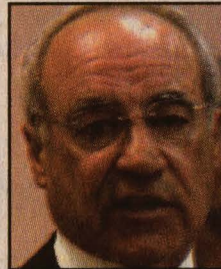
In the Democratic Party some delegates are more equal than others. Voters don't choose the unpledged super delegates who comprise nearly 40 percent of the number of delegates needed to clinch the Democratic nomination.

Unlike the pledged delegates earned through votes at state primary elections and caucuses, super delegates are not bound to any particular candidate - even one they've previously endorsed.

It's the left leaning champion of civil rights and social justice Democratic Party but at least one aspect of its nominating process is not so democratic.

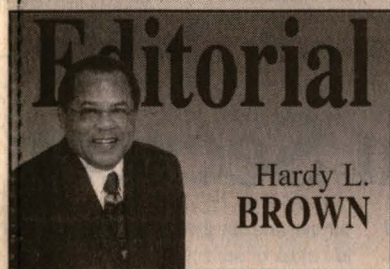
SB HOSPITALS AWARD GRANTS TO LOCAL HEALTHCARE ORGANIZATIONS

In January we celebrated the birth of Dr. Martin Luther King and February is Black History Month. Given Barack Obama's call for change, this an excellent time to reflect on the changes brought about by the Civil Rights movement. A key result of the Civil Rights movement was the creation of a new generation of Black leaders. What is fascinating is that these same veterans of the civil rights movement now seem to be having problems coming to grips with a changing world.

Many of today's Black leaders, from Andrew Young to Julian Bond to Jesse Jackson came into power in the 1960's and '70's on a wave of change. They proclaimed that new ideas and new approaches were needed for changing times. Today, we find that many of these same civil rights leaders resist change. They don't want the NAACP to change and they want to continue supporting the same Democratic Party leadership. They continue to believe that what worked in 1960 and 1970 will work today, in spite of any evidence to the contrary. That these same leaders now want to oppose change is an apparent contradiction that is worth exploring.

A good example of this seeming contradiction can be found in state-

ments made by Andrew Young. Many people have already seen the interview during which Andrew Young stated that, "Bill Clinton is just as Black as Barack Obama" and that former President Clinton probably, "Had more Black women than Obama". (To see the video visit <http://youtube.com/watch?v=breSVtVYSmo>). Andrew Young also states that he supports Obama for President...in 2016.

Andrew Young's statements about former president Bill Clinton's "Blackness" and supposed relationships with Black women vis-à-vis Obama are so outrageous that I am not going to even address them. However, his statement that he supports Obama for president in 2016 is far more interesting. In essence, he is saying that he would like to see Hillary Clinton as a two-term president. He seems to be jumping on the "Hillary has more experience and would therefore make a better president" bandwagon.

Given this implied nod to greater "experience" the question has to be asked. What experience did a 28 year old Andrew Young and a 31 year old Martin Luther King bring to the table when they became civil rights leaders in 1960? What experience qualified them to lead a national movement? I would argue that whatever experience

they had was less important than their youth and energy. The changing of the guard and the bringing in of new blood was what energized the civil rights movement and gave it its power.

Are we being disrespectful to established civil rights leaders by asking for change? Based on history, the answer seems to be no. History notes that Martin Luther King's approach was not universally supported by many of the powerful Black clergy of the time. In fact, the Progressive National Baptist Convention (PNBC) separated from the venerable National Baptist Convention with the expressed intent to support a more aggressive civil rights agenda in general and the efforts of Reverend Martin Luther King in particular. The PNBC web site explicitly states,

The PNBC movement was under girded by Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s struggle for freedom for African Americans. It was the PNBC that provided a denominational home for Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. and many of the Baptist leaders in the Civil Rights Movement. (see <http://www.pnbc.org/About%20Us/history.htm>)

This was a revolutionary act for the time. The National Baptist Convention was and still claims to be the largest organization of Black churches in the country. The forming of the PNBC was

a clear example of new young Black leaders challenging the existing Black elders. This makes Martin Luther King's classic, "Why We Can't Wait" even more relevant and provides additional historical context both for then and now.

Whether or not Barack Obama is the answer is not my principal concern. What is more important is that we start looking for new approaches to the issues that we face as a community. The fact that the established Black leadership is being challenged is a good thing and based upon actual history, honors the spirit of the civil rights movement. Black leaders have been talking for years about the need to do succession planning and bring in young people to be future leaders. Maybe now is a good time to begin putting those thoughts into action.

A Global War of Ideas

We are at war with Islamic fascism or what has come to be known as Jihadism. Our enemy is the idea among certain of the Muslim faith that they must bring the world to kneel before the prophet Mohammed. We don't need to guess at their intentions. Our foe says without hesitation that it is his intent to raise the flag of Islam first over Jerusalem then over the world. They have similarly demonstrated through their actions that they are willing to use any means necessary to accomplish that goal.

We seem more than willing to engage in myriad conversations about America's failure to live up to her own moral standards. Indeed for certain segments, it is all the rage to talk of American evil and to compare Republican administrations to the worst tyrants in history. As a nation, however, we remain rather reticent to move past the sophisms and face head-on the real threat to world peace and prosperity.

At bottom this is a war of ideas. Americans, therefore, must be zealots of a different kind. If we are going to be victorious, we must resist the temptation to embrace the multicultural relativism that teaches that all cultures are equally

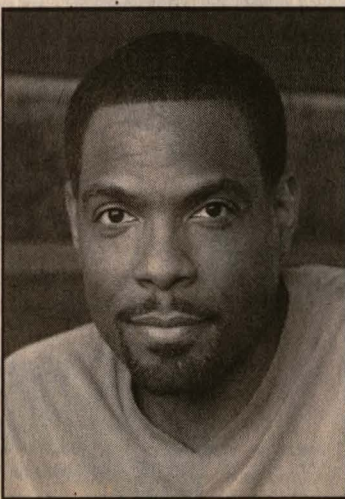
valuable and that all ideas are equally constructive. Victory demands that we make the objective and decidedly non-politically correct judgment that our culture is best – that our ideas of limited government, of individual and property rights, and most importantly, a secular government that supports and protects the expression of all religious ideas, is the best way or at least the best way we have found. Our ability to unflinchingly make this judgment will determine our eventual success or failure.

It is not xenophobia to confidently suggest that democratic expression is preferable to religious coercion; indeed, that liberty is preferable to slavery. We gain nothing by discarding our ideas in favor of the soft socialism of Europe (much to the chagrin of many here in Hollywood) and we stand to lose everything by ignoring Winston Churchill's maxim that "Compromise with tyrannical evil is not possible." Nor do we display leadership through capitulation to the will of a world government body. It is not the sanction of the United Nations that is the source and foundation of our leadership, but the embrace of our American ideals.

These ideas -- that all men have a right to their private property, their liberty and the right to worship God (or not as they see fit, and that the government has a duty to protect those rights -- are the ideas that have provided America with vast reservoirs of talent and innovation and continue to draw the best talent from around the world to our shores. If we are not able to make the moral case for why our American ideals are better than those of Jihadis, even with a force of marines a million strong, we are doomed to lose this war.

As this election takes shape, I am excited about the cultural changes America is poised to undergo. I am, however, much less concerned about the race or gender of any candidate than I am with their ability to properly identify the enemy and wage an aggressive war on many fronts -- a war that will ultimately determine not only the survival of America but also the survival of American ideals.

Confederate - Virginia. The senator also picked up significant support from older voters, women and lower income people, the core of Clinton's bases up to now.

With almost all precincts reporting, Obama won 75 percent of the vote in the District of Columbia and 64 percent in Virginia. He had 60 percent of the vote in Maryland with results from 67 percent of

the precincts.

On the Republican side, Senator John McCain swept Mike Huckabee former governor of Arkansas, virtually eliminating any threat that Huckabee might have posed to McCain's status as his party's all but certain nominee.

"I'm fired up and ready to go," stealing a line from Obama, McCain celebrated his victory taking a direct swipe at the Democratic senator's message of hope.

"To encourage a country with only rhetoric rather than sound and proven ideas

is not a promise of hope but a platitude," said McCain.

In all, 168 pledged delegates were at stake for the Democrats and 116 for the Republicans. The Democrats will divide delegates proportionally to the candidates' vote statewide and at the congressional level while the Republican races are winner-take all.

Obama's victories gave him a lead over Clinton among pledged delegates 1242 to 1175 according to preliminary counts by the Obama campaign and several expert

polls. Obama aides calculate that he also leads in total delegate counts that include so-called "super delegates", the party officers and elected officials who control 20 percent of the total delegates to the Democratic convention.

Clinton's campaign has suffered in recent weeks from overspending and internal upheaval, including the demotion of campaign manager, Patti Solis Doyle, late last week and the resignation Tuesday of the deputy campaign manager, Mike Henry.

History - Orel Beaver-Berry (Nov 2, 1913 - Sept 27, 2004) is the paternal grandmother of Angela Gordon-Nichols, founder of the Asante Scholarship Project. Ms. Beaver-Berry was a woman who believed in maintaining family records. Ms. Gordon-Nichols grew up estranged from her paternal family. She began to know her paternal grandmother after she was stricken with Alzheimers in the late 1980s. Because God gave Ms. Beaver-Berry the wisdom to maintain family records, Ms. Gordon-Nichols has been blessed with new family relationships on the paternal side of her family through found records. It is for this reason that Ms. Gordon-Nichols was led to honor Ms. Beaver-Berry's name with a scholarship when she died in 2004. Let it be known that this scholarship is founded and dedicated to the preservation and continuation of African-American tree charts. Because God's mercy endureth to all generations, Psalms 100:5.

The Scholarship - There will be three scholarships awarded this year, 1st place (\$500), 2nd place (\$250), 3rd place (\$125). These scholarships will be awarded to an African-American student, graduating from high school and will be attending college in the fall of 2008. The scholarship is not an academic scholarship and is based on a submitted essay and a three generation family tree chart submission.

Who is Eligible? To be eligible for the scholarship award, one or both of your parents must be African-American born in the United States. The applicant must live in the United States and attend or plan to attend a school in the United States. The applicant must also

be a graduating high school student.

How do you apply?

1) Submit a one page essay on "The importance of maintaining African-American family tree charts." The essay should include how the applicant has learned and maintained knowledge of his/her family tree.

2) Submit a copy of your family tree chart, tracing back at least three generations. Please include the names, date/place of births and date/place of deaths for all family members on the chart. Also indicate if you are tracing your paternal, maternal, or both sides of your family (if you are tracing paternal and maternal sides of your family, each side must go back three generations).

3) ALL ESSAYS SHOULD BE TYPED, DOUBLE SPACED, AND EMAILED TO AsanteScholar@aol.com.

IMPORTANT GUIDELINES: The subject of your email must state - Orel Beaver Berry Scholarship Entry. Your essay must be within the body of the email along with your name and contact info.

If you do not follow these instructions precisely, your entry will be disregarded. Applications for this project will be accepted from February 1, 2008 to February 28, 2008. All applications will be reviewed for quality, uniqueness, and creativity of the content in your essay. All applications will also be reviewed for family chart presentation and uniqueness. 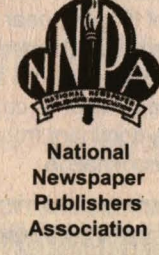
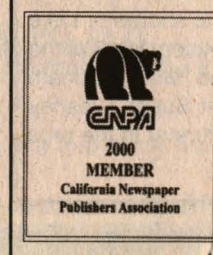

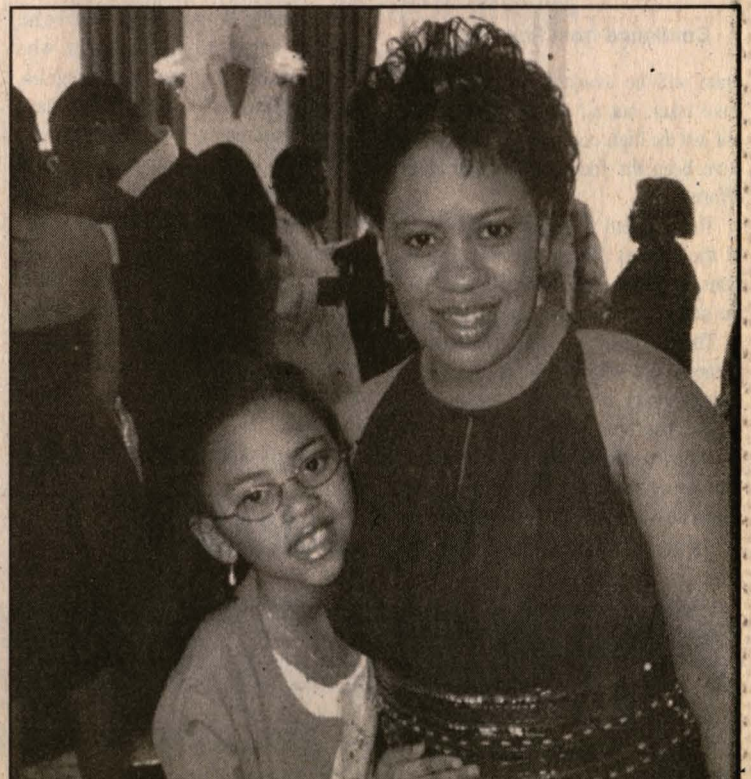

Some worry that if the super delegates wind up being the deciding factor in the nomination, it could be tantamount to ignoring the votes of millions.

While Obama is attracting racially and ethnically diverse voters in unprecedented numbers, the nation's super delegates are not nearly as racially diverse as the Dems would like you to believe. Less than 15 percent of super delegates are African-American.

"Ironically on the eve of a historic contest between a woman and an African-American, millions of voters will feel that their votes were disenfranchised," warns Donna Brazile, a top Democratic strategist who managed Al Gore's campaign in 2000.

"If 795 of my colleagues decide this election, I will quit the Democratic Party. I feel strongly about that," Brazile told CNN. She later softened her lament saying she would leave her leadership position within the Democratic party.

"Many of us never dreamed that we'd see such a day," said Dr. Dorothy Height, the 95 year old president emerita of the National Council of Negro Women. "We have to be on alert that we don't take this historical moment for granted."

"Obama and Clinton sought after my endorsement and I expect both to keep pressure up until the nomination is decided," said Inland Rep. Joe Baca (D) Rialto, a Clinton supporter. Baca and California Senators Barbara Boxer and Dianne Feinstein, who've also endorsed Clinton, are among California's 66 current super delegates.

Before 1972, party elders, such as Chicago Mayor Richard Daley and Charlie Buckley, the boss of the Bronx who helped John Kennedy clinch the 1960 nomination, wielded inordinate power.

But in the early 1970's the party's rules were reformed to open the process to grassroots activists, women, and ethnic minorities. So without reverting to the days of party bosses like Buckley, the Democrats decided to guarantee that elected officials would have a bigger voice in the nomination.

Super delegates were created as part of the Party's reforms after the debacle of 1972, when a too-liberal candidate, Sen. George McGovern, made it to the head of the ticket. The reforms emphasized the proportional allocation of delegates in primaries and the selection of super delegates who could provide the ballast needed in close contests or could guide the party away from a disastrous choice. They were to be "a safety valve," as one super delegate put it recently. The Republicans, who still have mostly winner-take-all primaries, didn't have the same need.

The last time a primary contest whittled down to two Democratic titans was in 1980, when Sen. Edward Kennedy and then-President Jimmy Carter duelled through a nine-month primary season - which left the party deeply divided and the nominee in doubt until August.

Super delegate Rep. Maxine Waters (D) California, a Clinton supporter, says there is a precedence for super delegates choosing a nominee. "In 1984, those unpledged delegates put Walter Mondale over the top."

Experts are "guessing" that the super delegates are decidedly in Clinton's Camp. If correct that could spell trouble for Obama. Super Tuesday, Clinton demonstrated some very significant strengths, especially with women, older voters, Latinos and working-class voters. And she won the state with the biggest block of voters, California.

Sen. Barack Obama on the other hand is heading to the convention with a war chest full of cash and a full head of steam sweeping primaries and caucuses, attracting new, young and independent voters, the type needed to win in November. But those power wielding pros who want jobs in a new administration, know not only whom they choose but when they choose could determine where they sit come Jan. 20. If you are a Democratic voter, it's time to start watching the super delegates.

warrant," said Silva. According to an officer's affidavit submitted in support of the search warrant, a confidential police informant had purchased rock cocaine from a man who retrieved the drug from the apartment.

During a hearing last week before Judge Dwight W. Moore in Fontana Superior Court the defense lawyers argued that the more than 400 pages of discovery, or evidence handed over by prosecutors fails to shed light on the sequence of events that lead to Carrera's violent death.

Epstein denied that the prosecution was impeding defense discovery or withholding evidence. "We've turned over everything determined not to be privileged," Epstein said.

Police raided Wiggins' three bedroom apartment, which he shared with his longtime girlfriend and three children, because they suspected rock cocaine was being sold from the home.

Police say Wiggins struggled with an officer but refused to say whose gun was fired, who pulled the trigger or even whether Wiggins had a gun of his own.

"I want to make it very clear that it was not a Rialto police officer that pulled the trigger," Ramos said. "It was not friendly fire."

The criminal complaint against Wiggins asserts two special allegations - that he "personally and intentionally" discharged a rifle and that he killed a peace officer. The complaint also claimed his actions "proximately caused great bodily injury and death to Carrera."

Silva said the defense will contest Deputy District Attorney Cary Epstein's (who is prosecuting Wiggins) planned use of "hearsay" testimony permitted under Proposition 115.

Silva said instead of calling the officers involved in the incident to testify during the preliminary hearing Epstein intends to call sheriff's deputies to testify in their behalf with "hearsay" testimony.

"That's unacceptable," says Silva, "Having the officers who were on the scene, when Carrera was shot, testify would help erode a "shroud of secrecy" that prosecutors have put around the case," he said. "We intend to issue our own subpoenas for the officers to testify at the preliminary hearing," said Silva.

Epstein said he would file a motion to quash the request for the officers to testify saying the defense would have to offer proof indicating the scope of testimony from the officers before the judge would grant approval.

Specifically, Silva and Holmes have told the court the defense wants to hear testimony from Rialto police Sgt. Andy Shourds, who allegedly referred to "friendly fire". The defense team is also seeking audio transcript from police radio transmissions during the shooting said to indicate officer-on-officer shooting.

Rialto Police Chief Mark Kling has adamantly said the shooting was not friendly fire.

During the preliminary hearing the burden of proof is on Epstein to present sufficient evidence to hold Wiggins for trial. Shortly after his arrest sheriff's officials determined Wiggins had a warrant in Grenada, Miss. for the sale of rock cocaine.

As the number of U.S. cases involving police drug raids gone wrong skyrocket legal experts are increasingly turning their attention to the "knights of the roundtable".

Some say instead of being a launching point for a thorough investigation, the roundtable can effectively lower the blue curtain of silence and set the tone for the frequently superficial inquiry that follows.

"To me, the roundtable is just a way to quickly justify cases," said Thomas Smith, chief investigator for the Cook County Office of Professional Standards or OPS, the civilian oversight agency once part of the Chicago Police Department. Smith witnessed many decisions from police roundtables during investigations from 1998 to 2002, when he left the agency.

He says roundtable proceedings are generally secret. Minutes aren't kept. Many participants throw away their handwritten notes. And district attorneys, often with the consent of plaintiffs' lawyers, successfully have sought to place protective orders on court files in dozens of cases to keep certain records, including roundtable reports from public view. But recent federal investigations into roundtable reports prepared by commanders as well as detective summaries of the proceedings provide a rare inside look at the super charged sessions.

Smith claims roundtables usually begin with the lead officer giving an overview of the shooting, referring to a hand-drawn diagram on the blackboard or grease board. Basic physical evidence often is not available or is sometimes neglected. Witnesses are brought in one at a time to give brief statements, but frequently these are not under oath or recorded. Sometimes, key witnesses aren't even interviewed, he said.

Meanwhile Silva and Holmes are insisting that despite this, local authorities rush to judgment.

"This is not an open shut case. We intend to prove there is more to the shooting of Sergio Carrera than meets the eye," said Silva. Wiggins could face 50 years to life in prison if convicted. The date for the preliminary has not been determined.

gram will be available to people who have taken out all types of mortgages, not just the high-cost subprime loans that have been the focus of previous relief efforts.

The program was put together by six of the nation's largest financial institutions, which service almost 50 percent of the nation's mortgages.

These lenders say they will contact homeowners who are 90 or more days overdue on their monthly mortgage payments. The homeowners will be given the opportunity to put the foreclosure process on pause for 30 days while the lenders try to work out a way to make the mortgage more affordable to homeowners.

"Project Lifeline is a valuable response, literally a lifeline, for people on the brink of the final steps in foreclosure," Housing and Urban Development Secretary Alphonso Jackson said at a joint news conference with Treasury Secretary Henry Paulson.

He said the goal was to provide a temporary pause in the foreclosure process "long enough to find a way out" by letting homeowners and lenders negotiate a more affordable mortgage.

In coming days, lenders will begin sending letters to homeowners who might qualify for the new program. Homeowners won't qualify if they have entered bankruptcy, if they already have a foreclosure date within 30 days, or if the home loan was taken out to cover an investment property or a vacation home.

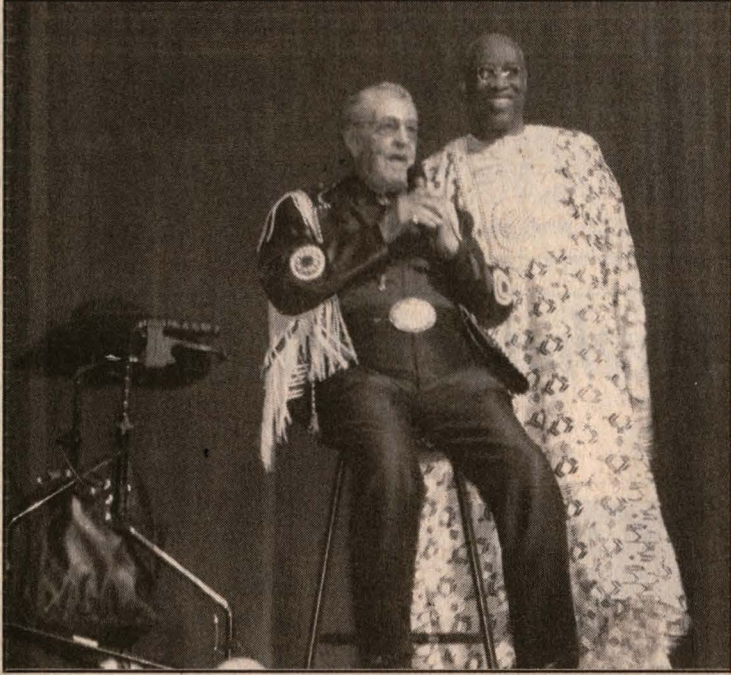

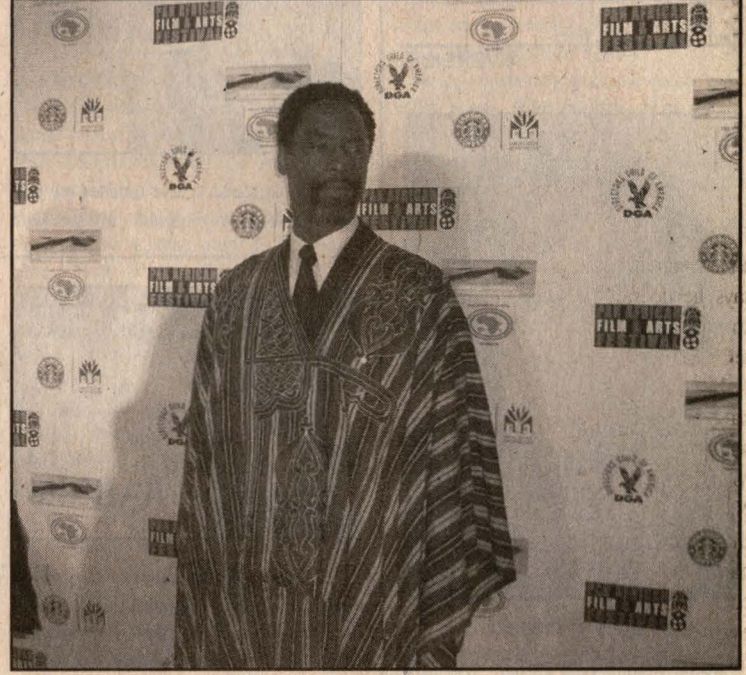

need to parent, but you (teachers) have to find out about the home environment," he said. Cosby believes that teachers have a responsibility to help the children and the best way to do that is to understand that many parents do not know what to do. "School has to do it because it is not in the home. It's important to understand that these kids may not have it at home so it has to happen here (at the school)."

Choosing to speak directly to parents about the gifts lavished on their children, Cosby said, "Your kids have no money." He fussed about parents buying sagging pants, and foul CDs. Of the pants he told them to pull them up. It is part of character correction.

Character education is very important. He spoke of people who cuss at their children in public and all the while he was speaking he kept telling

gems of stories that kept the day entertaining. There is no mantra. Manners are missing.

He was very critical of medicating children and placing Black students in special education classes. "Too many kids are in special education classes and they believe they should be there. They need to be talked to," Cosby admonished the audience.

Another area of concern was expulsions. He asked, "who is the bright person that came up with expelling kids for skipping school," he then stopped to let the question sink in. All this was at a luncheon held before he spoke with the students. His conversation with the students followed the same line and was at times embarrassing but nothing they didn't see night after night on television.

Energized, he said that people couldn't leave the library the way they came in. "Let's save these Black children!" he unapologetically proclaimed.

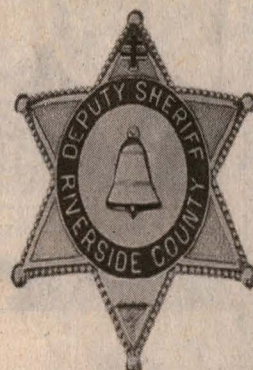

Is It A Cold Or The Flu?

Dear Dr. Levister: My 8 year old has a runny nose and dry cough, but says he doesn't feel sick enough to stay in bed or miss school. How can I tell the difference? A.T.

Dear A.T. The average child will have between six to 10 colds a year, while the average adult will get two to four colds a year according to The National Institute for Allergy and Infectious Diseases. And it can be hard to tell the difference between a cold and the flu, which can create even more anxiety for the parent or the person who has a cold.

Is there any way to tell the difference between a cold and the flu? In general, the flu is worse than the common cold, and symptoms such as fever, body aches, extreme tiredness, and dry cough are more common and intense. Colds are usually milder than the flu. People with colds are more likely to have a runny or stuffy nose. Colds generally do not result in serious health problems, such as pneumonia, bacterial infections, or hospitalizations.

But to avoid both, some precautions can be helpful.

Always remind children to:

- Cover their nose and mouth with a tissue when they cough or sneeze. Have them throw the tissue away after they use it.

- Wash their hands often with soap and water, especially after they cough or sneeze. If water is not near, use an alcohol-based hand cleaner.

- Remind them not to touch their eyes, nose, or mouth. Germs often spread this way.

Actually, those are good precautions for anyone.

And remember: Because colds are caused by viruses, treatment with antibiotics is ineffective. Antibiotics are only effective when given to treat bacterial infections.

In Ancient Egypt, games were part of religious life. Their most popular game was *Senat* in which counters, or markers, were moved around a game board. Winning the game came by one player removing all of his/her pieces before the opponent did (Hawass, Tutankhamun, p235). A wall painting on the tomb of the Egyptian queen Nefretari, wife of Ramses II (1304-1237 BC), shows her playing

Senat. It symbolizes the struggle between good and evil as well as stands magically for rebirth and resurrection. The African games known as *Mancala* or *Wari* are among the oldest games, dating back at least to 5000 BC. In these games, beans, seeds, and other small objects were moved around a playing board with hollowed out cups. A player tried to capture as many objects as possible. Both *Senat* and *Mancala* games and four other types were discovered when the tomb of Tutankhamen -- an Egyptian king who reigned from 1348-1339 BC -- was discovered. An Egyptian board game of primitive "checkers" from 1000 BC is in the British Museum. Another type -- called *Nine Men's Morris*, *Mill*, *Morelles*,

or *Morels* -- has been found carved in the roofing slabs of an Egyptian temple and dating between 1400 and 1300 BC. The object of the game, of which there are many versions, is for each player to try to capture an opponent's piece and to prevent the opponent from moving any pieces. Note how closely this resembles Chess as we know it today.

But Western literature admits that the origin of Chess is uncertain. Whenever such a statement is made, experience has taught me that the uncertainty most likely indicates it originated in Africa. Many Western scholars believe chess started in Pakistan as an offspring of a Hindu game under the Sanskrit name "Chaturanga" about 500 AD. Others say it is from India

or China. Then the game spread to Persia where it was given the name "Shah" (which means "king") and "Shah mat" (the king is dead). The Arabs learned the game when they conquered Persia in the 600's and they introduced it into Europe by way of Spain, Sicily, and Constantinople. The pieces were named for roles in the courts of kings during the Middle Ages-king, queen, knight, and bishop. Chess' strategy and play are modeled on how wars were fought in the Middle Ages. By the 16th century chess moves had assumed their modern form.

Chess is a board game consisting of a miniature battlefield whereby the opponents engage in organized attacks and defense, each conducted with the definite

objective of protecting ones king from being trapped or "checkmated" (i.e. where the king is unable to escape capture). Every new game is a different battle and the players are the generals who plan the battle. Chess is one of the oldest of all games of pure mental skill as well as one of the most interesting and mind focusing and challenging of all board games. Every game of chess can be recorded in the form of a code so that after the game is over it can be studied to learn what was done properly and improperly. "After-study" is fundamental to any thinking process that calls for choices, decisions and solutions.

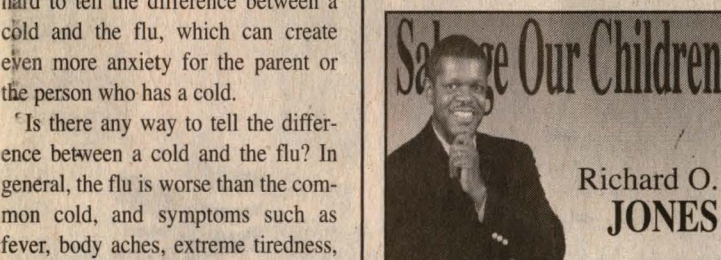
Obama was born in Hawaii in 1961 to a Black Kenyan father and white American mother who met while attending the University of Hawaii where his father was enrolled as a foreign student. His father went on to Harvard University to pursue a PhD. he then returned to Kenya, where he died in an auto accident in 1982. His mother married another foreign student from Indonesia when Barack was about five-years-old and they moved to the stepfathers' country. Obama's mother died of ovarian cancer a few months after the publication of his 1995 memoir, *Dreams from My Father*.

In the memoir, Obama describes his experiences growing up in his mother's American middle class family. His knowledge about his African father, who returned once for a brief visit in 1971, came mainly through family sto-

ries and photographs. Of his early childhood, Obama writes: "That my father looked nothing like the people around me-that he was Black as pitch, my mother white as milk-barely registered in my mind." The book describes his struggles as a young adult to reconcile social perceptions of his multiracial heritage. He wrote that he used alcohol, marijuana, and cocaine during his teenage years to "push questions of who I was out of my mind".

Obama also proves that although we have distractions in our lives we can go on to become a person of integrity, dignity, and earn the respect and support of people of all races. 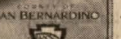

Veteran Official Oversees Super Bowl XLII

Following the history made in Super Bowl XLI, the NFL came right back and added to its legacy, as Mike Carey became the first African American to referee a game in Super Bowl history.

On the heels of Tony Dungy and Lovie Smith becoming the first African Americans coaches to lead teams to the Super Bowl - Dungy's Colts won - the NFL, in Super Bowl XLII, finally selected a Black man as its head official.

Referees are rarely the center of attention during media week, but Carey's elevation to Super Bowl referee - a pioneering move - changed all that.

It seems kind of weird that we have seen a Black coach and Black quarterback lead their respective teams to NFL glory, but we had never seen a Black man entrusted with the prestigious assignment to oversee a Super Bowl.

"I think of the social revolution going on and the social position of the world," Carey explained, "and you can see change happening right before your eyes."

"I'm proud of being the first, although there were others, like Al Jury and Johnny Green, that paved the way for me. I appreciate them and I'm humbled."

"I think people are learning to look through the transparencies of our outside. After last year (Dungy's breakthrough), I want to believe that we are getting to the place where people will judge you by the content of your character."

Added Dan Rooney, owner of the Pittsburgh Steelers and archi-

tect of the Rooney Rule that requires at least one minority be included in the interview process before an NFL team can fill a coaching vacancy: "It (Rooney Rule) took a lot of people to buy into it for it to happen. We knew we needed to do something to change the pattern. I'm happy to see Mike get this opportunity and just maybe the spirit of the (Rooney) Rule is soaking in."

Carey, in his 18th year as an NFL official, was notified by the NFL front office that he would be in Super Bowl XLII referee following the conference championship games. He said he was more excited than surprised.

"When I got the call, I felt great," Carey remarked. "It took a while for my feet to hit the ground."

"What really touched me was the camaraderie of the officials. I got so many e-mails and text messages of congratulations. The general theme was that they were all honored to see me at this point."

Carey noted that he wasn't really surprised because he felt that he has been a competent official.

"You always hope something like this will happen," he explained. "Each year you have to feel like you were good enough to get the call."

Well, the NFL finally agreed and Carey now finds himself in referee pioneering lore.

The officials at the Super Bowl are chosen on merit, with the highest-ranked at each position getting an assignment at the Super Bowl. Carey has been among the NFL's top crew chiefs for a decade, but has never been the referee, or even a position official, at the Super Bowl.

"We selected Mike based on

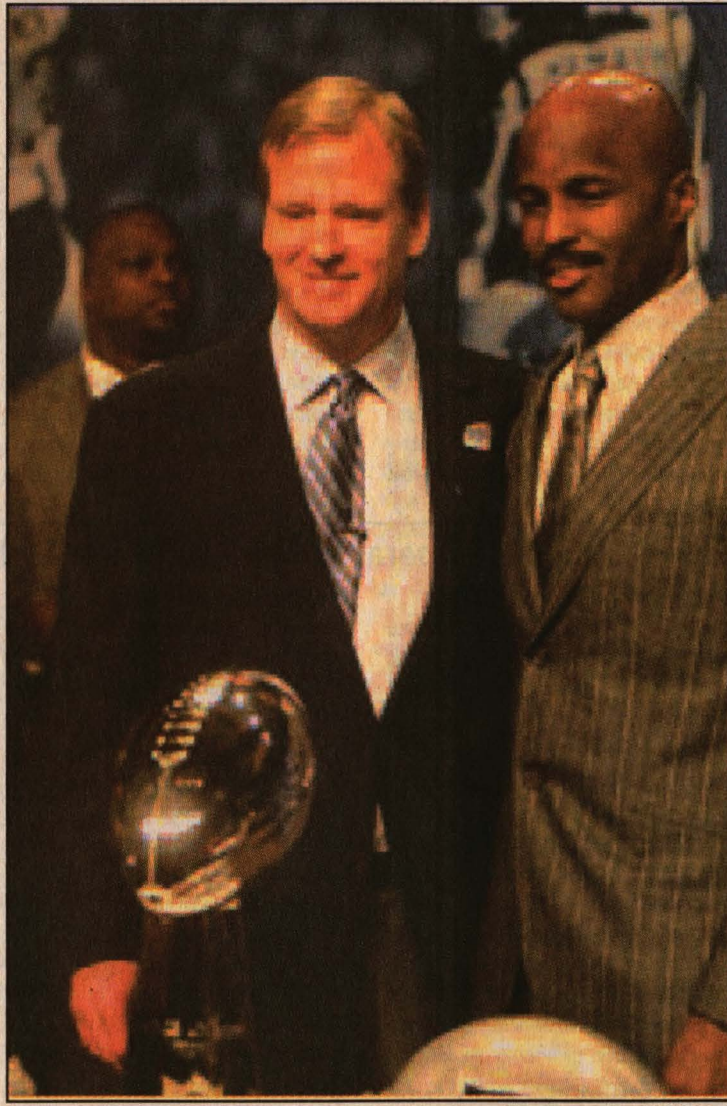

his record," NFL Commissioner Roger Goodell said. "He has been working hard at his craft and he has earned this select opportunity."

Carey said he hopes his effort inspires other minorities to consider officiating. However, he said there is no easy route to reaching the pinnacle of officiating.

Beginning his officiating career in 1972 working Pop Warner football games in the San

Diego area, Carey became an official in the Western Athletic Conference (WAC) in 1985. The NFL then hired him in 1990 as a side judge and promoted him to referee in 1995.

He was only the second African American official to become a referee - Johnny Grier was the first in 1988.

"I never dreamed of being a referee," said Carey, a former running back at Santa Clara University. "When my friend

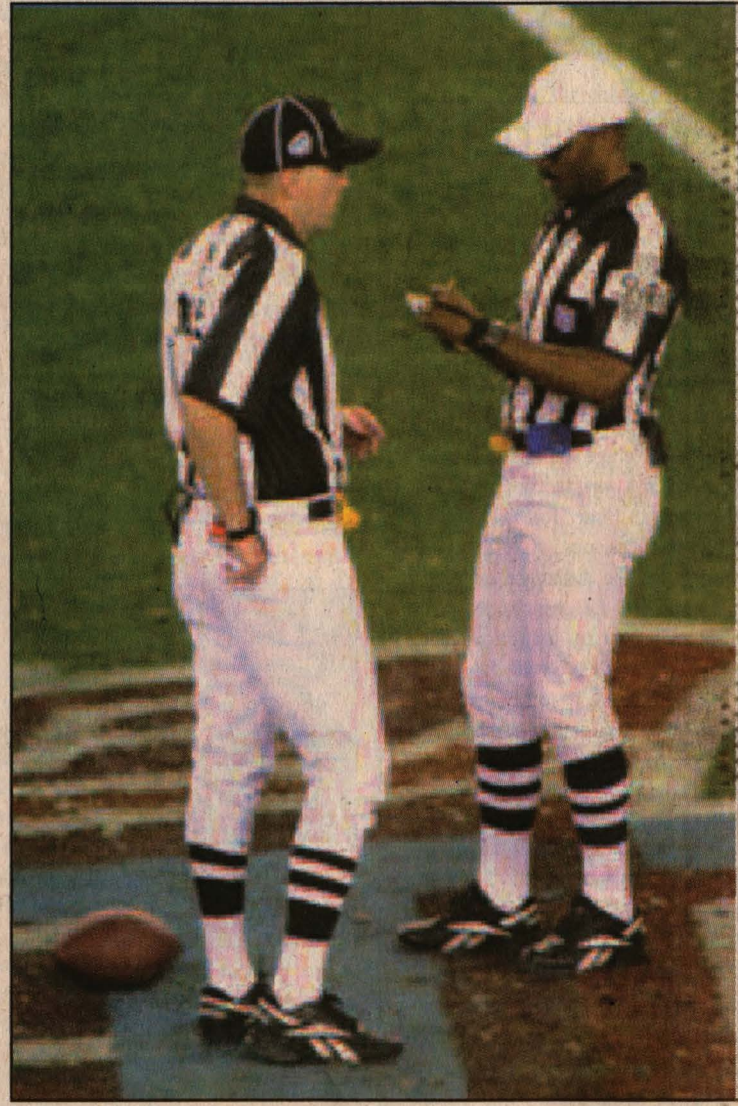

asked me if I wanted to try officiating, I said, 'I don't like those guys; why would I do that?'"

Now, 36 years later, Carey, whose brother, Don, is also an NFL official (back judge), is respected in the NFL for his thorough pre-game preparation, professional demeanor and fair play.

As for Super Bowl XLII, Carey said he wasn't nervous.

"I was not afraid of making a

mistake," he said. "I've been trained to do this and I just called on my training and instinct. As we (officials) always say, 'expect the unexpected!'"

Super Bowl XLII left us with some incredible and historic moments, and the game was won fair and square by the players. I hardly noticed Carey during the game, and to me, that means he did his job.

LA's Football Fans Are Missing Out!

After 13 seasons without an NFL Franchise Football team Fans are the real losers!

Like most LA area football fans, I had convinced myself years ago that having a team in the Greater Los Angeles Area was just not a big deal. After all, getting a full schedule of TV games, usually three on Sunday, rather than being subjected to an afternoon blackout as was often the case when the Raiders failed to sellout the gigantic coliseum before the Thursday afternoon deadline.

But, as I sat in the upper deck of the luxurious "University of Phoenix" stadium looking out over the pre-game preparations and pondering the previous week's activities, I thought to myself, what a selfish and narrow point of view. Here I am sitting in the middle of a strawberry patch getting ready to watch the culminating event of what has become the America's annual showcase to the world. And, it's all happening in Glendale, Arizona not in Los Angeles the second largest media market in America.

It was January 31, 1993, when the NFL last brought its extravaganza to Los Angeles. The Rose Bowl, where 98,374 fans watched Troy Aikman, Emmitt Smith, Michael Ervin and Ken Norton trounce the Buffalo Bill's Jim Kelley, Thurman Thomas and Bruce Smith 52-17. Two years later, LA's last NFL franchise shipped out of town rendering Los Angeles ineligible as a Super Bowl host city and casting it into an ongoing spiral of rumors, speculation and eventual despair.

Since 1993, every preceding Super Bowl has gotten bigger surpassing any vision founding father Pete Roselle could have ever imagined for his game and the number 2 media market in the United

State has been missing out on all of it.

The 1999 game in Miami's Pro Player Stadium produced \$396-million in economic impact to South Florida according to the Super Host committee. The Arizona Host committee is reporting \$400-million in economic impact for the Valley of the Sun generated from last week's game.

The Super Bowl has become the single greatest revenue generating event only behind the Olympics Games. With the recent award of the 2010 game, South Florida is preparing to host its 10th Super Bowl game, surpassing New Orleans as the all-time leader. But beyond the obvious economic advantages and prestige that goes along with hosting a Super Bowl there are a number of social and civic advantages that also come with the game. An entire generation of Angelinos has been deprived of the experiences, sites, and sounds that make-up America's greatest sports event. It seems that our civic leaders have betrayed us.

Los Angeles lost its expansion opportunity to Houston at the beginning of the decade and essentially locked itself into a permanent predatory position. This position has failed Los Angeles, but worked out surprisingly well for the NFL. By threatening to move to LA other teams have successfully leveraged their respective positions, usually to get what they wanted.

True, the average fan will never get to go inside the game unless he's prepared to drop a king's ransom on the open market or gets lucky through some outside source. Ticket prices are \$700.00 and \$900.00 face value and generally are not available to the public. Typically, you can expect to pay \$2500.00 to \$3000.00 for a scalped ticket.

But, there are nearly 100 NFL sanctioned events held throughout the week for fan enjoyment, many of which have been created just for the fans and priced accordingly. Every young Pop Warner player should have an opportunity to punt, pass, and kick at the NFL

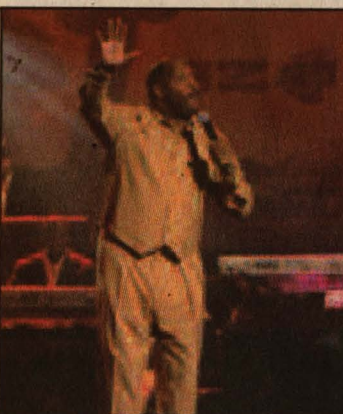

Experience. There are dozens of celebrity fashion shows, parties, golf tournaments and any number of fund raising galas to attend.

When Los Angeles became ineligible after the 1995 season, Miami and pre-Katrina New Orleans dominated the competition. Now other favorable weather cities like Phoenix, Houston, Tampa and soon Dallas have built new modern facilities and will pose serious competition every year. Indianapolis, Houston and New Orleans are now busy preparing bids for the 2012 Super Bowl.

According to NFL Commissioner Roger Godell the league has no current plans for expansion which leaves Los Angeles stuck in its current predatory position. The festivities began with a seminar delivered by Dr. Daniel E. Walker, a faculty member in SBVC's History department. Dr.

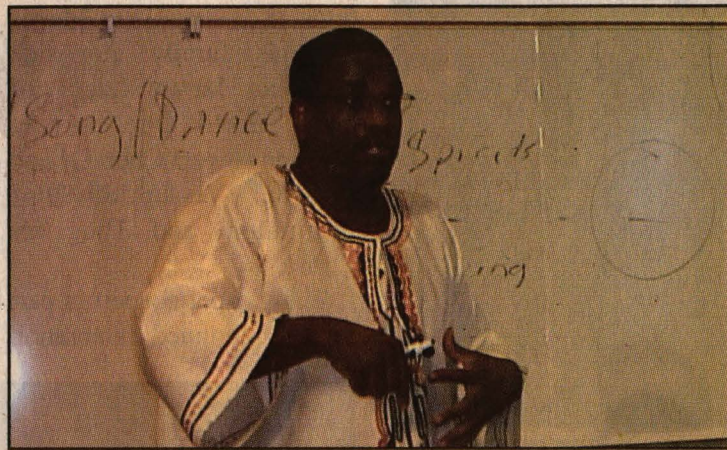

He also covered the Civil Rights movement, the Black Power period, and the history of Gospel music.
