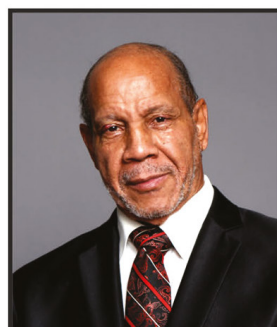

## Jim Harbaugh Era Begins in Los Angeles

The hiring of Jim Harbaugh to re-tool and lead the Los Angeles Charger football team by Dean Spanos, may be the most assertive head coach move in the history of the organization.

Fresh off this year's national championship win as head coach of the Michigan Wolverines (2015-2024), Jim Harbaugh says he is ready for the next challenge by returning to professional football. He will return to the league in which he has experienced significant past success, the NFL. The Los Angeles media recently gathered at SoFi Stadium to embrace the Harbaugh era.

The Harbaugh clan reminds us of a military family as young Jim and his siblings experienced several life challenges with every new coaching job father Jack Harbaugh took. As Jack accepted coaching positions in Ohio, Kentucky, Iowa, Michigan and California, the family had to adapt to sudden change and the challenges new environments bring.

Jim Harbaugh has been a winner throughout his career as a player and coach. He was the quarterback at Michigan (1882-86), selected by the Chicago Bears in the first round (1887) followed by a 14-year career in the NFL to include a stint with the San Diego Chargers

(1999-2000).

After a brief role as an assistant coach for his father Jack at Kentucky, Harbaugh gives praise to former Raiders owner Al Davis, who recognized he may be pretty good as the Oakland Raiders quarterbacks' coach (2002-2004). Then it was back to college coaching at the University of San Diego (2005-2006), and was later hired by Stanford (2007-2011) leading the Cardinal team to two bowl games, including the Orange Bowl.

The San Francisco Forty-Niners came calling next, hiring Harbaugh to remedy eight straight years of missing the playoffs. Harbaugh

experienced instant success by reaching the NFC Championship game in each of his first three years, including the Super Bowl against his brother in 2012. Over the years, he successfully added to a glistening resume, changed the culture and won at every level.

Harbough is a reflection of the optimism, success and body of work the Spanos family has been looking for.

When team owner Dean Spanos told Harbaugh over the phone that he might be bringing a rain storm with him to the press conference at SoFi Stadium, Harbaugh responded, "We are the storm". Certainly a reflection of the optimism and body of work that the Spanos family has been looking for. When asked how he will approach the necessary changes to make the Chargers a winner, Harbaugh said, "Good old fashion effort and teamwork," a collaborative effort, "Work together, win together".



## Antonio Ray Harvey California Black Media

Members of the California Legislative Black Caucus (CLBC) announced plans to introduce a package of bills this year designed to address the recommendations the California reparations task force made last year in its final report.

Certain advocacy groups and individuals say the legislative package the lawmakers announced on Jan. 31 and Feb. 1 does not go far enough. They criticize the absence of direct

cash payments, an element they campaigned for as a centerpiece to any compensation due to the descendants of people who endured slavery in the Deep South and more than a century of social, economic and political injustices after abolition.

Chris Lodgson, a member of the Coalition for a Just and Equitable California (CJEC), released a statement after CLBC members made the announcement during a press briefing with reporters held on Jan. 31.

## California Black Caucus Introduces Reparations Package

“As we've communicated to elected officials directly for some time, we believe any Reparations package must be targeted explicitly and exclusively to California's 2 million Black American descendants of persons enslaved in the U.S. (American Freedmen),” Lodgson said in a letter obtained by California Black Media.

“In addition, a true reparations package must include timely, tangible benefits (i.e direct monetary payments). Our team will continue to review the proposals announced (Jan. 31 and Feb. 1) and any related bill/resolution language as they become available. But the time for strong, bold Reparations is now, not later.”

Members of CLBC first presented 14 reparations bills on Jan. 31 while on a Zoom call with Black media outlets from across the state. CLBC chairperson Assemblymember Lori

D. Wilson (D-Suisun City) outlined the goals of the package and stated its intention to right the wrongs of historical injustices that African Americans endured in the state of California.

Sen. Steven Bradford (D-Gardena), the vice chair of CLBC, presented additional pieces legislation to implement reparations at the State Capitol on the first day of Black History Month, Feb. 1.

Wilson said the Caucus's package is a “first step” in a multi-year effort to implement the legislative recommendations in the report.

Wilson was joined on the briefing by Assemblymembers Corey Jackson (D-Moreno Valley), Reggie Jones-Sawyer (D-Los Angeles), and Akilah Weber (D-La Mesa) – all members of the CLBC.

The covid-19 pandemic would be a wake-up call for America, advocates for the elderly predicted: incontrovertible proof that the nation wasn't doing enough to care for vulnerable older adults.

The death toll was shocking, as were reports of chaos in nursing homes and seniors suffering from isolation, depression, untreated illness, and neglect. Around 900,000 older adults have died of covid-19 to date, accounting for 3 of every 4 Americans who have perished in the

pandemic.

But decisive actions that advocates had hoped for haven't materialized. Today, most people — and government officials — appear to accept covid as a part of ordinary life. Many seniors at high risk aren't getting antiviral therapies for covid, and most older adults in nursing homes aren't getting updated vaccines. Efforts to strengthen care quality in nursing homes and assisted living centers have stalled amid debate over costs and the availability of staff. And only a small percentage of people are masking or taking other precautions in public despite a new wave of covid, flu, and respiratory syncytial virus

infections hospitalizing and killing seniors.

In the last week of 2023 and the first two weeks of 2024 alone, 4,810 people 65 and older lost their lives to covid — a group that would fill more than 10 large airliners — according to data provided by the CDC. But the alarm that would attend plane crashes is notably absent. (During the same period, the flu killed an additional 1,201 seniors, and RSV killed 126.)

“It boggles my mind that there isn't more outrage,” said Alice Bonner, 66, senior adviser for aging at the Institute for Healthcare

Improvement. “I'm at the point where I want to say, ‘What the heck? Why aren't people responding and doing more for older adults?’”

It's a good question. Do we simply not care? I put this big-picture question, which rarely gets asked amid debates over budgets and policies, to health care professionals, researchers, and policymakers who are older themselves and have spent many years working in the aging field. Here are some of their responses.

The pandemic made things worse. Prejudice

"While many only associate direct cash payments with reparations the true meaning of the word, to repair, involves much more. As laid out in the report, we need a comprehensive approach to dismantling the legacy of slavery and systemic racism," Wilson said in a statement. "This year's legislative package tackles a wide range of issues; from criminal justice reforms to property rights to education, civil rights and food justice."

Bradford first introduced legislation Senate Bill (SB) 490 in August 2023. The bill would create a new state agency called the California American Freedman Affairs Agency (CAFAA).

The CAFAA would be responsible for managing the infrastructure required to manage reparations as determined by the Legislature and Governor.

"Our coalition's unwavering commitment has been to pursue lineage-based reparations,

encompassing direct monetary payments/compensation, state recognition of descendants as a protected class, and the establishment of the CA American Freedman Affairs Agency through SB490 (Bradford)" Lodgson stated.

The report documented numerous cases of social injustices against Black Californians that occurred either by custom or by law across the state. For example, last year the city of Palm Springs issued an apology for destroying the homes of Black people on short notice under imminent domain laws in an area of the city known as Section 14. However, the affected families that lost their homes were never compensated for them.

The descendants of the Section 14 property owners filed a claim against Palm Springs seeking \$2 billion for alleged harms due to the removal of their forebears, according to the family members' attorney, Areva Martin.

# Meet Anneisha Williams: The Voice Behind the \$20 Minimum Wage Movement

In April, the minimum wage for fast food workers, whose employers have sixty or more outlets in the state, will be raised to \$20 per hour. Legislation authorizing the increase was signed into law by Governor Gavin Newsom last year.

“California is home to more than 500,000 fast-food workers who – for decades – have been fighting for higher wages and better working conditions,” Newsom declared when signing AB1228. The legislation takes California one step closer to fairer wages, safer and healthier working conditions, and better training, “by giving hard working fast-food workers a stronger voice and seat at the table.”

Many of those fast food workers are women and people who support families with their wages. As the legislation was announced, one such woman, Anneisha Williams stood by the Governor’s side. A mother of six children and a fast food worker, she took to the podium and spoke. “This

is for my ancestors. This is for all the farm workers, all the cotton pickers, this is for them. We ride on their shoulders because they fought some rocky roads as well. This is our blood, this is our sweat and this is our tears,” she proclaimed regarding their work in the industry.

## Studies Show Different Findings

The arguments over the effects of raising the minimum wage at the state as well as the federal levels have gone on for a long time and arguments both for and against its overall impact on the economy have also been debated. Depending on who you talk to or what study you review, increasing the minimum wage will mean fewer jobs, while in other studies any overall impact resulting from a wage increase for fast food workers is offset by the need for fewer social services and/or may

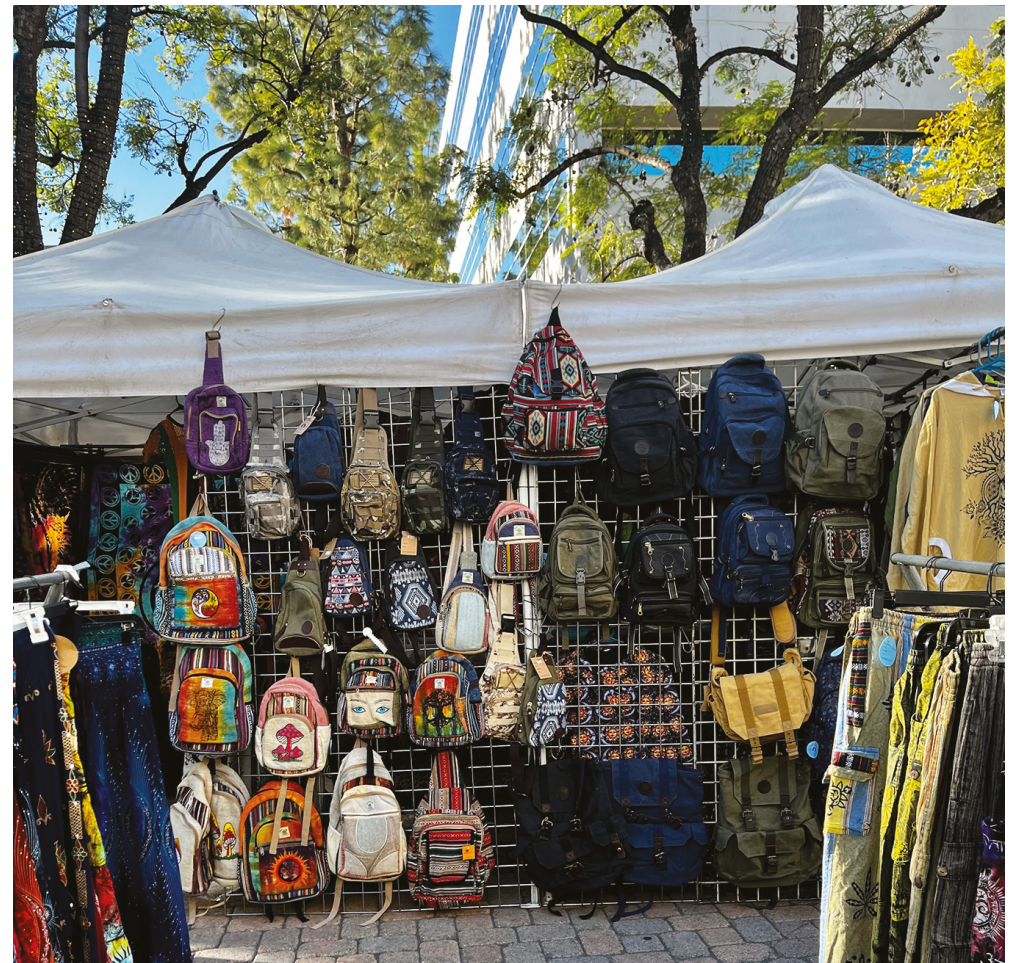
## 44th Annual Black History Month Expo and Parade Saturday February 10 2024 in Riverside

not result in a loss of jobs.

## Fast Food Council

The new legislation also establishes a Fast Food Council through the California Department of Industrial Relations. The council will consist of both business and labor leaders as well as a chairperson appointed by the Governor. The council is intended to be neutral and will make recommendations to various governmental agencies regarding policy, working conditions and industry standards. Although California has had other, similar advisory councils, this is the first to be dedicated to a single industry.

Williams, an employee of Jack in the Box, who stood beside the governor and inspired others with her speech the day he signed AB 1228 into law, recently spoke with Black Voice News about the new legislation and what it will mean to the people, like her, who are frontline workers and the industry in general.

**BVN:** I saw your speech and I was so moved by

it. And not just me, I sensed from the reaction of those in attendance that everyone present that day was moved by it. I don't know what you call that? The power of yes? By the end, everybody was chanting, 'Yes!'. I thought it was an inspiring speech. (Follow this link to view Williams' speech in its entirety.)

**AW:** Thank you.

**BVN:** I know I'm calling it a speech, but you were talking about your struggles and your fight. So I think a lot of people don't know what that is. Can you give us a bit about what the Fight for \$15 has been about and how you got involved? But first, tell us a little bit about who you are.

**AW:** My name is Anniesha Williams, I work at Jack in the Box, I am a shift leader at Jack.

**BVN:** Can you tell us what that is?

**AW:** A shift leader is basically someone in-charge under the management. You're helping give people breaks, you're in charge of the store if the manager is not there. You move like the manager but you're under them. You don't have higher power like that, you have some power though. I worked my way up [to that position] through blood, sweat and tears.

**BVN:** Tell us about that. You started on the line?

**AW:** I started out just as a regular crew member like everyone else. I still work the drive thru [window] but I move around in the store. It has its joys, but then you have jealousy with [co] workers and I'm battling that, [but the position] has its perks. According to Williams, some employees feel she thinks she is better than them because she is a shift leader.

against older adults is nothing new, but “it feels more intense, more hostile” now than previously, said Karl Pillemer, 69, a professor of psychology and gerontology at Cornell University.

“I think the pandemic helped reinforce images of older people as sick, frail, and isolated — as people who aren’t like the rest of us,” he said. “And human nature being what it is, we tend to like people who are similar to us and be less well disposed to ‘the others.’”

“A lot of us felt isolated and threatened during the pandemic. It made us sit there and think, ‘What I really care about is protecting myself, my wife, my brother, my kids, and screw everybody else,’” said W. Andrew Achenbaum, 76, the author of nine books on aging and a professor emeritus at Texas Medical Center in Houston.

In an environment of “us against them,” where everybody wants to blame somebody, Achenbaum continued, “who’s expendable? Older people who aren’t seen as productive, who consume resources believed to be in short supply. It’s really hard to give old people their due when you’re terrified about your own existence.”

Although covid continues to circulate, disproportionately affecting older adults, “people now think the crisis is over, and we have a deep desire to return to normal,” said Edwin Walker, 67, who leads the Administration on Aging at the Department of Health and Human Services. He spoke as an individual, not a government representative.

The upshot is “we didn’t learn the lessons we should have,” and the ageism that surfaced during the pandemic hasn’t abated, he observed. Ageism is pervasive. “Everyone loves their own parents. But as a society, we don’t value older adults or the people who care for them,” said Robert Kramer, 74, co-founder and strategic adviser at the National Investment Center for Seniors Housing & Care.

Kramer thinks boomers are reaping what they have sown. “We have chased youth and glorified youth. When you spend billions of dollars trying to stay young, look young, act young, you build in an automatic fear and prejudice of the opposite.”

Combine the fear of diminishment, decline, and death that can accompany growing older with the trauma and fear that arose during the pandemic, and “I think covid has pushed us back in whatever progress we were making in addressing the needs of our rapidly aging society. It has further stigmatized aging,” said John Rowe, 79, professor of health policy and aging at Columbia University’s Mailman School of Public Health.

“The message to older adults is: ‘Your time has passed, give up your seat at the table, stop consuming resources, fall in line,’” said Anne Montgomery, 65, a health policy expert at the National Committee to Preserve Social Security and Medicare. She believes, however, that baby boomers can “rewrite and flip that script if we want to and if we work to change systems that embody the values of a deeply ageist society.”

Integration, not separation, is needed. The best way to overcome stigma is “to get to know the people you are stigmatizing,” said G. Allen Power, 70, a geriatrician and the chair in aging and dementia innovation at the Schlegel-University of Waterloo Research Institute for Aging in Canada. “But we separate ourselves from older people so we don’t have to think about our own aging and our own mortality.”

The solution: “We have to find ways to better integrate older adults in the community as opposed to moving them to campuses where they are apart from the rest of us,” Power said. “We need to stop seeing older people only through the lens of what services they might need and think instead of all they have to offer society.”

That point is a core precept of the National Academy of Medicine’s 2022 report *Global Roadmap for Healthy Longevity*. Older people are a “natural resource” who “make substantial contributions to their families and communities,” the report’s authors write in introducing their findings.

Those contributions include financial support to families, caregiving assistance, volunteering, and ongoing participation in the workforce, among other things.

“When older people thrive, all people thrive,” the report concludes.

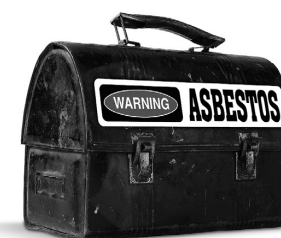
Future generations will get their turn. That’s a message Kramer conveys in classes he

teaches at the University of Southern California, Cornell, and other institutions. “You have far more at stake in changing the way we approach aging than I do,” he tells his students. “You are far more likely, statistically, to live past 100 than I am. If you don’t change society’s attitudes about aging, you will be condemned to lead the last third of your life in social, economic, and cultural irrelevance.”

As for himself and the baby boom generation, Kramer thinks it’s “too late” to effect the meaningful changes he hopes the future will bring.

“I suspect things for people in my generation could get a lot worse in the years ahead,” Pillemer said. “People are greatly underestimating what the cost of caring for the older population is going to be over the next 10 to 20 years, and I think that’s going to cause increased conflict.”

It kind of bothers [me], but it took a lot to get where we're at right now, not just for me but all fast food workers. [There were] a lot of closed doors and a lot of, 'Yes, we're with you.' And [also] a lot of, 'No, we don't care what you guys have to say. You guys don't deserve what you are getting.' We've been through a lot of that. I'm doing this [Fight for \$15] not just for me and my kids, but for all fast food workers who are afraid and when I say afraid, I mean afraid to speak up, afraid to just be them[selves].

The Fight for \$15" movement had its beginnings in 2012 in response to low wage workers' inability to cover their costs of living while earning such a low salary. It was also triggered in part, due to the stressful working conditions that reportedly exist in many service industry jobs that pay minimum wage. The minimum wage in California in 2012, was \$8 per hour.

**BVN:** What do you think drives that fear?? Is it fear of losing your job or standing out?

**AW:** Yes. Yes.

**BVN:** How did you overcome that? You had to step out and say we deserve to be paid more. How did you make the decision to do that?

**AW:** Because I have six kids! That's one of the things. I had to think, 'These short hours, these reduced] hours. Something has got to get done.' If I don't open my mouth—like they say, 'Closed mouths don't get fed.'—I'm not going to be able to feed my kids. So I had to [speak up].

**BVN:** When you talk about short hours and cut hours do you think that's industry wide? You don't know when you're going to be working or that your shift may change?

**AW:** Correct. Sometimes, you don't know until the end of the week on a Sunday. Or, sometimes they don't post it on a Sunday, you don't get it until a Monday and they expect you to know your schedule. That's not right. You have a

system that's set up where you are supposed to be able to check your scheduling but sometimes that doesn't work [or the schedule is] not even accurate and you're [considered] at fault for that. There's a lot of things that need to be changed and need to be heard. It's time for workers to overcome that fear and start opening their mouths. I'm not saying you have to run and complain about everything, but open your mouths about justice. . . the right things. . . [about] the way it should be done. We all have mouths to feed.

Williams went on to acknowledge that life is not perfect or fair. But added, "It's time to stop struggling in a multi billion dollar business that can afford to help and 'a lot of these workers are crying for help.'" According to Williams, many fast food workers are sleeping in their cars.

**BVN:** Tell me about that? Are you saying

there are employees in this industry who are homeless?'

**AW:** Yes, There are some workers who are homeless. You might not even know they're homeless. They don't talk about it. They don't look like it because they try to do the best they can to prepare [for work] and that is a struggle. Not being able to pay your rent is a struggle. This \$20 [an hour] is going to change a lot of lives.

**BVN:** I know you're saying that \$20 an hour is going to change a lot of people's lives, but in many places in the state, like the LA area for example, prices and rent are expensive.

**AW:** And rent just went up. It's a start, it's a big start for us and we got here and we're going to aim to get higher. This is not our final stop. We want more and we deserve more and like Ciara (the singer) says, 'There are levels to this.' We've [seen] senators and mayors and we never thought we'd get there. I never thought we'd get there, talking to [officials].

**BVN:** Were they listening ? Did you find they would hear you out whether or not you thought they were going to do anything?

**AW:** Oh, yes, because guess what? Some of the people[we talked to] have been fast food workers so they know the struggles. Some of their parents [were]fast food workers.'

**BVN:** Even though officials you talk to may have been fast food workers or whose parents were fast food workers, they hear arguments that fast food workers are kids, they don't have responsibilities and they don't need the money. Can you talk to us about that?

**AW:** I'm so sick of hearing that. You know why? [Because of] some of the things we've had to take on the job. There have been [workers] who've lost their lives on the job, [were] spit on the job, had food thrown at them.

Before issuing the apology, Palm Springs officials, investigated the removal process of the houses, and they voted to provide compensation in the form of reparations.

Martin said the city has not taken any action yet.

The CLBC bill packages were released three weeks after Gov. Gavin Newsom presented a \$291 billion spending plan to the California Legislature on Jan. 10. Newsom expects the state to have a \$37.9 billion deficit, a figure much lower than the nearly \$68 billion deficit projected by the nonpartisan Legislative Analyst Office (LAO) in December.

Bradford said the state budget will affect potential reparations policies.

“Without a doubt, the budget will impact what we do but we’ve often said in California the budget is a reflection of our priorities and a reflection of our values,” Bradford said during his news conference. “If we say we value reparations and want to heal the harms of slavery in this country and in this state, we have to make this a priority.”

Last year, on June 28, the nine-member panel, officially called the Task Force to Study and Develop Reparations Proposals for African Americans, submitted a 1075-page, comprehensive reparations plan that includes more than 115 recommendations and a survey.

Khansa Jones-Muhammad, better known as “Friday Jones,” a reparations advocate, educator, and Vice President of the Los Angeles Reparations Advisory Commission (RAC), sent a message to the CLBC to share her thoughts about the reparations package.

The RAC is a seven-member task force comprised of activists, academicians, attorneys, racial justice advocates, and more. It is supported by Los Angeles’ Civil + Human Rights and Equity Department’s Office of Racial Equity.

RAC’s main function it to advise the city on the formation of a reparations pilot program for Californians who are descendants of enslaved Black Americans in the Los Angeles area.

“I just emailed @CABlackCaucus to let them know we deserve better #Reparations bill package with targeted, timely, tangible, monetary

resources for Black American descendants of U.S. chattel slavery,” Jones-Muhammad posted Feb. 1.

Wilson and Bradford said that additional legislation concerning legislation would be considered in the future.

“The Caucus is looking to make strides in the second half of this legislative session as we build towards righting the wrongs of California’s past in future sessions,” Wilson stated.

**BVN:** Is there something particular about the circumstances fast food workers work under?

**AW:** It has somewhat to do with the public, it can be a joy or it can be kind of cruel, not just with the public but with the industry. Some of it has to do with managers who have their favorites. They give them hours and take away your hours. I’ve had to deal with that. We’re trying to change that. We’re trying to come up with some type of fair scheduling.

**BVN:** Is that part of what the fast food council will do? What some people may not be aware of is not only are you getting a salary increase but a fast food council is also being put in place to address some of the other issues in the industry. Let’s talk a bit about the new council’s role.

**AW:** It’s important because we finally have a seat at the table. That’s what we have been asking for. Let’s see if we can negotiate. Let’s see if we can come up with something that works, not only for you, but for us. Let’s become one brain. Let’s stop fighting and bickering and pointing the finger.

**BVN:** Although it’s new and the first in the nation for fast food workers, in California there’s been similar things, including a council where labor and business set standards, but unlike the others, this is for a single industry. It’s going to be split between business and labor and there’s going to be a chairperson appointed by the governor. What do you think about that?

**AW:** I believe it’s going to be absolutely wonderful. I want it to feel like a family on the committee. I want there to be nuggets of understanding. This industry is not perfect, but we can make it what it should be. We just want to be heard. Everyone wants to be heard, to have that voice we’ve all been waiting for.

Williams went on to explain how her grandmother used to work in the fields, how she had picked cotton.

To let her [my grandmother] know that I’m out here fighting feels good because she wasn’t able to fight in times like that. The farm workers have just become a part of a union. History is being made, Martin Luther King Jr. and Cesar Chavez paved the way for us.

**BVN:** Those were some of the ancestors you were talking about in your speech.

**AW:** Yes. I kept saying we’re going to do this, and God said ‘Let me show you.’
